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CHAPTER 1

INTRODUCTION

This is the Sixteenth Annual Report of the Mojave Basin Area Watermaster to the Riverside County Superior Court pursuant to the Stipulated Judgment in City of Barstow, et al., vs. City of Adelanto, et al. and related cross-complaints, which were consolidated into Case No. 208568. The Stipulated Judgment addresses water supply shortages in the Mojave Basin Area through the creation of a Physical Solution based upon the allocation of responsibility for correction of annual overdraft and for maintaining historical average annual flows between Subareas.

The Stipulated Judgment requires the Watermaster to file an annual report with the Court by April 1 of each year (changed to May 1 in 2008). The required contents of the annual report are set forth in Section V (B), Paragraph 24 (k) of the Judgment.

Scope of Report

This Report summarizes most of the information required by the Stipulated Judgment and includes a summary of the Watermaster activities and water supply conditions for Water Year 2008-09. Appendix L to this report consists of a detailed accounting of surface water and groundwater production for Water Year 2008-09. Also included in Appendix L is a list of Base Annual Production ("BAP") transfers and changes in ownership. History of Litigation

Complaint. The original complaint was filed by the City of Barstow and Southern California Water Company in San Bernardino County Superior Court on May 30, 1990 and was transferred to Riverside County Superior Court on November 27, 1990. The complaint alleged that the cumulative water production upstream of the City of Barstow has overdrafted the Mojave River system and requested an average annual flow of 30,000 acre-feet of surface water to the City of Barstow area. The complaint also included a request for a writ of mandate to require the Mojave Water Agency ("MWA") to act pursuant to its statutory authority to obtain and provide supplemental water for use within the Mojave Basin Area.

MWA Cross-Complaint. On July 26, 1991, the MWA filed its first amended cross-complaint in the case, naming substantially all Producers of water within the Mojave Basin Area, including Parties downstream of the City of Barstow. The MWA cross-complaint requested a declaration that the available native water supply to the Mojave Basin Area is inadequate to meet the demands of the combined Parties and requested a determination of all of the water production of whatever nature within the Mojave Basin Area.

Arc Las Flores Cross-Complaint. On July 3, 1991, Arc Las Flores (Rancho Las Flores Ltd. Partnership) filed a cross-complaint asking that the appropriative, overlying and riparian rights of Arc Las Flores be determined to be prior and paramount to any rights of the Plaintiffs and other appropriators.

Negotiations, Trial and Judgment. Because of the magnitude and complexity of the case, numerous parties agreed to conduct good faith negotiations, beginning in early 1992, with the objective of devising an equitable solution to the Basin Area's water supply problems and avoiding extensive and expensive litigation. In the ensuing months a committee of attorneys, engineers and other individuals that were generally representative of all types of producers and all Subareas of the Basin Area conducted intense negotiations that resulted in a proposed Stipulated Judgment. The proposal created a class of Minimal Producers (that is, Producers using ten acre-feet of water per year or less) who were dismissed from the case. The proposal also directed the MWA to create an administrative procedure, acceptable to the Court, by which Minimal Producers could participate fairly in the Physical Solution.

Over 75 percent of the parties agreed to the Stipulated Judgment which was entered by the Court on September 22, 1993, binding all stipulating parties. After entry of the Stipulated Judgment, additional parties agreed to its terms. These parties represented over 80 percent of the verified water production in the Basin. A trial of the claims of the non-stipulating parties began on February 6, 1995 and was completed on March 21, 1995. Final Judgment was entered on January 10, 1996 adopting the physical solution set forth in the Stipulated Judgment.

Fourth District Court of Appeal and California Supreme Court Review. Nine non-stipulating parties referred to as the "Cardozo Group" chose to appeal the Judgment entered by the Superior Court. The Appellate Court issued a Tentative Opinion in April 1998 and received oral argument from both the stipulating and non-stipulating parties in May 1998. The Appellate Court issued its final opinion on June 1, 1998. The final opinion affirmed in part and reversed in part the Superior Court Judgment by excluding specific non-stipulating parties (the Cardozo Group) from the Superior Court Judgment and at the same time affirming it as to the stipulating parties. The decision also remanded the issue of the amount of transferable production rights for Jess Ranch Water Company back to the Superior Court for a new determination.

The MWA board voted in June 1998 to seek California Supreme Court Review of the Appellate Court's decision. A petition for review was filed with the Supreme Court in July 1998 and the Supreme Court granted review of the case on August 26, 1998. Oral Arguments were heard by the Supreme Court on June 5, 2000 and its opinion was issued on August 21, 2000. The Supreme Court's opinion affirmed in part and reversed in part the June 1, 1998 opinion of the Fourth District Court of Appeal. The Supreme Court affirmed the Court of Appeal's

decision "in all respects," except it reversed the Court of Appeal decision as to the Jess Ranch Water Company.

The Court of Appeal had affirmed the Judgment as to the stipulating parties but had reversed it as to the Cardozo Appellants and as to Jess Ranch Water Company. The Court of Appeal opinion essentially excluded the Cardozo Appellants from the Stipulated Judgment, including the Judgment's assessment provisions. Further, the Court of Appeal granted Judgment to the Cardozo Appellants in the form of injunctive relief to protect their riparian and overlying water rights to the current and prospective reasonable and beneficial need for water on their respective properties.

Final Resolution of Cardozo Group and Jess Ranch Water Company Appellants. Effective August 6, 2002 the Cardozo appellants and MWA, on behalf of the stipulating parties, reached agreement regarding the Cardozo appellants' water rights. Consistent with the ruling from the California Supreme Court in this case, Cardozo Group's right to pump water from the ground underneath their respective lands for the current and prospective reasonable and beneficial need for water on their respective properties was recognized by the Stipulating parties. Further, to settle all outstanding issues in connection with the Cardozo Group water rights, MWA and Cardozo agreed that "if the parties who stipulated to the Judgment are in full compliance with the Judgment there shall be a rebuttable presumption that the Cardozo Appellants' water rights are not being interfered with."

In addition, all remaining water rights issues related to Jess Ranch Water Company and the Stipulating Parties were settled on August 16, 2002. Stipulation for Intervention and Entry of Judgment for Jess Ranch Water Company was filed in Riverside County Superior Court on August 23, 2002.

Summary of the Judgment

For purposes of defining and implementing a physical solution, the Basin is considered to consist of five distinct but hydrologically interrelated "Subareas." Each Subarea was found to be in overdraft to some extent due to the use of water by all of the producers in that Subarea. In addition, historically some Subareas were found to have received at least a part of their natural water supply from water flowing to them from upstream Subareas either on the surface or as

subsurface flow. To maintain that historical relationship, the average annual obligation of any Subarea to another is set equal to the estimated average annual natural flow (excluding storm flow) between the Subareas over the 60-year period 1930-31 through 1989-90. If the Subarea obligation is not met, Producers of water that does not bear a replacement obligation in the upstream Subarea must provide makeup water.

To maintain proper water balances within each Subarea, the Judgment establishes a decreasing Free Production Allowance ("FPA") in each Subarea during the first five years and provides for the Court to review and adjust, as appropriate, the FPA for each Subarea annually thereafter. The FPA is allocated among the Producers in the Subarea based on each Producer's percentage share of the FPA. All water produced in excess of any Producer's share of the FPA must be replaced by the Producer, normally by payment to the Watermaster of funds sufficient to purchase Replacement Water.

Each Producer's percentage share of FPA in a Subarea was determined by first verifying the maximum annual production (called BAP) for each Producer during the five year, 1986-90, Base Period and then calculating each Producer's percentage share of the total of all of such BAP in the Subarea. All such percentage allocations are of equal priority.

Producers in each Subarea are allowed to produce as much water as they need annually to meet their requirements, subject only to compliance with the Physical Solution set forth in the Judgment. An underlying assumption of the Judgment is that sufficient water will be made available to meet the needs of the Basin in the future from a combination of natural supply, imported water, water conservation, water reuse and transfers of FPA among parties.

Special provisions for environmental protection are included in the Judgment, including the creation of a Biological Resources Trust Fund.

MWA was appointed as the initial Watermaster by the Court to administer the Judgment and the Physical Solution set forth therein.

The Physical Solution

Replacement Water: Keeping Subareas in Balance. The amount of water that may be produced in a Subarea in any year by a Producer free of any replacement obligation is that Producer's share of the Subarea's FPA. During the first five years that the Judgment is in effect each Producer's share of the FPA in each of the five Subareas, expressed as a percentage of that Producer's BAP is as follows:

Water Year 1993-94 - 100 %
Water Year 1994-95 - 95 %
Water Year 1995-96 - 90 %
Water Year 1996-97 - 85 %
Water Year 1997-98 - 80 %

Before the end of the fifth year and each year thereafter, the Watermaster must analyze conditions in each Subarea and recommend to the Court any increase or further reduction in FPA. The Judgment specifies factors that must be taken into consideration by the Watermaster in the development of an FPA adjustment recommendation. Beginning with the sixth year and each year thereafter, the FPA established by the Court for each Subarea will be allocated to Producers in the ratio of their respective share of the BAP in the Subarea.

Any Producer who produces in any year an amount of water in excess of that Producer's share of the FPA for a Subarea must pay the Watermaster a Replacement Water Assessment. The Watermaster then assumes responsibility for replacing such excess production. The Replacement Water Assessment for a Producer will be equal to the number of acre-feet of excess production by that Producer multiplied by the Replacement Water Assessment Rate per acre-foot as adopted annually by the Watermaster. It is the Watermaster's responsibility to acquire Replacement Water.

Makeup Water: Meeting Subarea Obligations. Both average and minimum annual flows must be maintained between adjoining Subareas. Each year an accounting will be made of the amount of such flows. Whenever the amount is less than the minimum amount required by the Judgment the Producers in the upstream Subarea must pay the Watermaster for Makeup Water to be delivered to the downstream Subarea.

If the actual flow in a year is more or less than the average Subarea Obligation then the upstream Subarea may receive a "credit" or "debit" that can offset any future deficiencies or surpluses.

The cost of Makeup Water will be recovered from Producers within the Subarea incurring the Makeup Obligation through a Makeup Water Assessment. Such assessment will be pro-rated among all production that does not bear a Replacement Obligation. It is the Watermaster's responsibility to acquire Makeup Water.

Administrative Assessment: Paying the Cost to Administer the Judgment. Costs of monitoring flows, verifying annual production, collecting assessments, preparing an annual report to the Court and other such costs will be recovered through a uniform Administrative Assessment against all production within the Basin Area. The Administrative Assessment will be payable quarterly when quarterly production reports are filed.

Transfers: Buying, Selling or Leasing BAP or FPA. The Judgment provides a framework for BAP or FPA to be bought, sold or leased within Subareas and between Subareas. For instance, a party who was allocated one percent of the FPA in a Subarea could lease that allocation to a second party in a private transaction. The second party could then produce additional water free of a Replacement Obligation.

The Judgment sets forth some rules governing transfers. The rules are designed to assure that the total consumptive use within a Subarea does not increase as a result of any transfer.

Biological Resource Mitigation: Protecting Species and Habitat. The Judgment contains unique provisions for assuring that the water needs of endangered and other species and of riparian habitat in the Mojave Basin Area are protected. Groundwater level standards are set in several key areas along the River. The Judgment must be administered in certain respects with the intent to meet the standards.

In the event standards are not met, a trust fund is established by the Judgment to provide money to buy water, construct wells or other projects proposed by the California Department of Fish and Game ("CDFG"). The trust fund, which is capped initially at \$1,000,000.00 (in 1993 dollars), will be financed by an escalating per acre-foot assessment on production beginning at \$0.50.

Producer Responsibilities: Reporting and Assessments. Each Producer is responsible for reporting accurately the amount of water produced and for paying all applicable assessments promptly. Any transfer of BAP or FPA or change in purpose of use must also be reported.

Subarea Advisory Committees. The Producers in each Subarea have elected a committee to advise the Watermaster on the administration of the Judgment. The California Department of Fish and Game is an ex-officio member of the Subarea Advisory Committees for the Alto and Baja Subareas.

Watermaster: Administering the Judgment for the Court. MWA was appointed the Watermaster initially. MWA or any subsequent appointee can be removed by the Court for failure to administer the Judgment properly and fairly.

The Watermaster is responsible for monitoring flows, verifying water production, reporting to the Court, collecting assessments and conducting studies.

The Watermaster must comply with the Brown Act regarding notices and meetings and with the Public Records Act regarding access to data and records.

CHAPTER 2

SUMMARY OF WATERMASTER ACTIVITIES

During Water Year 2008-09, the Mojave Basin Area Watermaster consisted of Art Bishop, Kimberly Cox, Richard Hall, Beverly J. Lowry, Mike Page, Doug Shumway and Jim Ventura. Kimberly Cox and Art Bishop served as Chairman and Vice Chairman respectively. Kirby Brill served as Executive Officer, Joanne Lowrance as Secretary and Kathy Cortner as Treasurer.

The first Watermaster meeting of the 2008-09 Water Year was held on October 29, 2008 and six additional meetings were held throughout the year. Copies of the minutes of the meetings as well as other official records are maintained and available at the office of the Watermaster, which is located at 22450 Headquarters Drive, Apple Valley, CA 92307.

As required by the Judgment, the Watermaster prepared the Fifteenth Annual Report of the Mojave Basin Area Watermaster for Water Year 2007-08, which was published under the date May 1, 2009.

Watermaster adopted recommendations for FPA for Water Year 2009-10 as indicated in Watermaster's Fifteenth Annual Report to the Court, with options for Baja. The Court subsequently adopted Watermaster's recommendation (see Chapter 5).

Actions taken by the Watermaster during the year included acceptance of the Report on Audit for Fiscal Year 2007-08, approval of the Administrative Budget for Water Year 2009-10, approval of Replacement, Makeup, Administrative and Biological Assessment Rates for Water Year 2009-10. The Administrative Budget and Assessment Rates for 2009-10 were adopted and are summarized on Table 2-1.

Transfers

There were 199 transfers of FPA and Carryover FPA during the year. These transfers are reported in Appendix E. There were 34 transfers of BAP. Transfers of BAP are reported in Appendix E, K & L (Table 8). Any additional transfers of unused 2008-09 FPA that may take place prior to June 1, 2010 will be reported in Appendix E of the Watermaster's Annual Report for 2009-10.

Rules and Regulations

The Rules and Regulations that were adopted by Watermaster June 30, 1994 and revised December 11, 1996, March 23, 2005 and October 29, 2008 remain in effect.

Biological Resources Trust Fund

The Biological Resources Assessment Rate for 2008-09 was \$0.72 per acre-foot. There were two expenditures from the Biological Resources Trust Fund during the year for the invasive plant species removal project in the amount of \$250,000 for Fiscal Year 2007-08 and \$250,000 for Fiscal Year 2008-09. This project was completed by the Mojave Desert Resource Conservation District in conjunction with funds from the Mojave Water Agency and the California Department of Fish and Game Biological Resources Trust Fund. These expenditures were acknowledged by the Watermaster Board at a regularly scheduled meeting.

The Biological Resources Assessment Rate for 2009-10 was increased to \$0.77 per acrefoot.

Storage Agreements

A Storage Agreement between MWA and the Watermaster covering each Subarea was approved during the 1994-95 Water Year and remains in effect.

Watermaster entered into a storage agreement with a party to the Judgment on June 1, 2002. The status of storage accounts is reported in Appendix F.

Subarea Advisory Committees

The Judgment requires that every third year the Subarea Advisory Committees elect new members. Each Subarea Advisory Committee consists of five members elected by the producers, with the California Department of Fish and Game acting as an ex-officio member on the Alto and Baja Committees. Nominations, voting and tabulation of results were conducted by Watermaster during January, February and March 2009.

Water Production and Verification

In order to document water usage and to determine each Producer's Replacement Water and Makeup Water Obligations, the Judgment provides for the collection, analysis and verification of annual water production by Producers within each of the five Subareas beginning with Water Year 1993-94. All Producers are required to file quarterly statements (or as otherwise specified in the Rules and Regulations) of production. Verification of production for Water Year 2008-09 was conducted by the Watermaster staff and included verification of all parties to the Judgment. The verified production of all parties for Water Year 2008-09 is assembled and presented in Appendix B and Appendix L (Tables 1-7).

Section 11 of the Rules and Regulations sets forth the criteria for monitoring production. The Watermaster informed certain Producers by letter dated July 1, 2009, of their responsibility to measure production in accordance with the terms of the Judgment and the Rules and Regulations. Watermaster will continue its efforts to obtain voluntary compliance with the Rules and Regulations from each Producer.

Streamflow, Precipitation and Other Data

Various data, including streamflow and precipitation data, are needed to estimate the natural water supplies accruing to each Subarea and to calculate compliance with certain Subarea obligations. Streamflow data required by the Watermaster was for the most part furnished by the U.S. Geological Survey ("USGS"). The MWA, under a Cooperative Agreement with the USGS, currently funds 50 percent of the stream gage operation and maintenance at the Deep Creek, Lower Narrows, Barstow and Afton stations. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers ("ACOE") funds the West Fork Mojave River gage. Beginning with the 1993-94 Water Year, the frequency of direct measurements at the Lower Narrows was increased from once to twice monthly in order to improve the record. The measurements were subsequently increased from twice monthly to weekly during the 1995-96 Water Year, a practice which continued through the 2008-09 Water Year.

The USGS conducted a review of its measurement procedures and statistical data analysis procedures for the Lower Narrows gage in 1998 and reported that the "published stream flow records represent the best determinations of flow possible given the primary data collected in support of the stream flow gaging stations". The USGS concluded by saying that it is

confident that its flow measurement and computation techniques will be found adequate and stream flow records validated.

Records of the discharge of reclaimed wastewater to the Mojave River downstream from the Lower Narrows gage were furnished by the Victor Valley Wastewater Reclamation Authority ("VVWRA"). These discharge records are used to determine the contribution of the VVWRA discharge to the Alto Subarea's annual flow obligation to the Centro Subarea.

Precipitation data utilized by the Watermaster are compiled from records obtained from the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration ("NOAA") for Lake Arrowhead, Victorville and Barstow precipitation stations. For 2008-09 precipitation data was obtained from USGS for Lake Arrowhead (Rock Camp gage) to supplement missing NOAA data in February, March, June July, August and September of 2009. NOAA reported the Lake Arrowhead gage inactive in July 28, 2009.

Related MWA Activities

MWA entered into a water banking demonstration project with the Metropolitan Water District (MWD) for the delivery of up to 75,000 acre-feet of their entitlement water from the State Water Project for storage in the Mojave Basin. MWD has 10 years to take return delivery of the water, through exchange of MWA entitlement from the State Water Project for delivery to MWD. About 25,000 acre-feet was delivered in November and December of 2003. Another 20,000 acre-feet was delivered in November and December of 2005. MWD took back 26,000 acre-feet in 2007 and 8,495 acre-feet in 2008.

The MWA is working with the City of Victorville and other public entities to develop the Oro Grande Wash recharge project. This project will recharge regional aquifers within the Victor Valley region. Two deep multi-port (Westbay type) sophisticated monitoring wells, two standard water table monitoring wells and an exploratory soil boring were constructed along the Oro Grande Wash to characterize and monitor the recharge program slated for the region. The MWA acquired grant funds from the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) (Proposition 50) to fund a portion of the cost of the project. A pipeline and recharge facilities are being designed and additional funding is being secured for the project. Construction is scheduled to initiate in 2010.

The "Regional Recharge and Recovery Program" (R³) has three components: 1) the Upper Mojave Basin Hydrogeologic Model 2) the Upper Mojave River Well Field and Water Supply Pipeline and 3) a potential new pipeline and recharge facility that would allow groundwater recharge South of the existing Rock Springs spreading facility.

The Upper Mojave Basin Hydrogeologic Model is a sophisticated model of the entire upper Mojave River Basin which includes the Oeste and Alto Subareas and the Este Subarea west of the Helendale fault. This model has been used to provide detailed data regarding the optimal design and operation of the R³ project well field and recharge facilities.

The MWA finished an approximate 1.5 year drilling project to install three deep multiport (Westbay type) sophisticated monitoring wells along the upper reach of the Mojave River to support the monitoring of the effects and performance of the R³ project. Construction is scheduled to initiate in 2010.

MWA began the planning phase for development of a groundwater basin conceptual model for the Cento and Baja Subareas. This included the gathering of literature and compiling existing data to determine the extent of additional data and investigation needed to develop the conceptual model. The effort for Centro – Baja is similar to efforts conducted in Alto, Oeste and Este, and to a lesser degree the Harper Lake area. The purpose of the conceptual model is to define the groundwater basin hydrologic conditions and ultimately, if appropriate, develop a numerical computer model for planning purposes.

The MWA has completed the pilot study for the Este Subarea to determine the feasibility of estimating the groundwater production of minimal users using aerial photography, sophisticated land use software and local control groups. The pilot study has been deemed successful, adequately estimates minimal user production and the remaining adjudicated Subareas are being reviewed using the same methodology as the Este Subarea. A rigorous and statistically sound estimate of current Minimal Producer groundwater production in the adjudicated area is expected by Summer 2010.

The MWA has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Mojave Desert Resource Conservation District (MDRCD) for the removal of invasive, non-native plants along the Mojave River riparian corridor. The invasive plants, primarily tamarisk, displace native riparian plants species, increase the risk for flooding and fire hazard and use disproportionate quantities of groundwater within the Mojave River floodplain aquifer. In Fiscal Year 2007-08 grant funding from the DWR and \$250,000 from the Biological Resources Trust Fund (with

concurrence of the DFG) were used to remove approximately 153 acres of invasive plants spread over a geographical extent from the West Fork of the Mojave River to the vicinity of the Victor Valley Wastewater Reclamation Authority (VVWRA) treatment plant. The program continued in Fiscal Year 2008-09 with a combination of another \$250,000 from the Biological Resources Trust Fund and additional funding from the MWA and a Federal grant with the goal of removing another 330 acres of invasive plants from the area near the VVWRA to the vicinity of Helendale. The program is anticipated to continue in 2009-10 and beyond with additional monies from Federal grants, the Biological Resources Trust Fund and MWA until eradication efforts have covered the entire River area within the boundaries of the MWA.

CHAPTER 3

WATER SUPPLY CONDITIONS

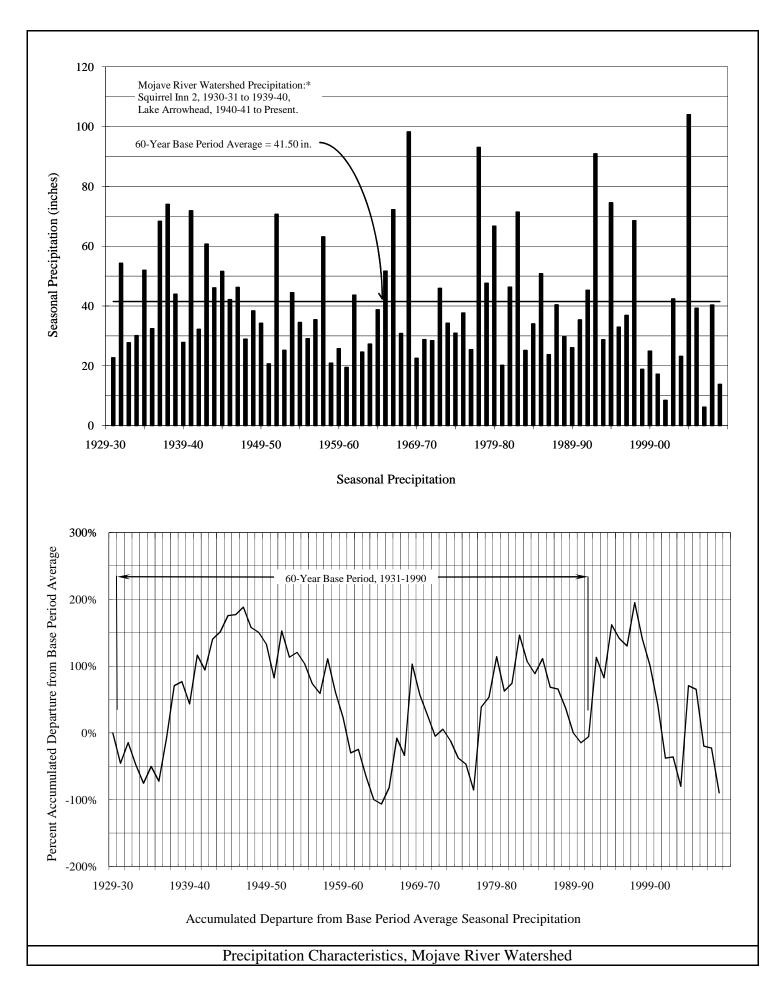
After experiencing near average precipitation during 2007-08, the precipitation in the Mojave River Watershed during 2008-09, as measured at Lake Arrowhead was below average at about 33 percent of the 60 Year Base Period average. The combined flow of the West Fork Mojave River and Deep Creek during the 2008-09 Water Year was about 47 percent of the 60-Year Base Period average.

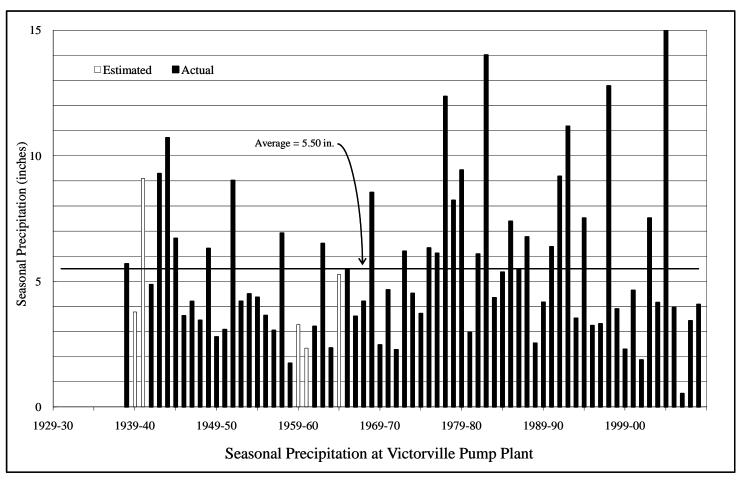
Precipitation During 2008-09

Rainfall in the mountain areas is the principal source of natural water supply to the Mojave Basin Area. During the 2008-09 Water Year the precipitation at Lake Arrowhead amounted to 13.76 inches, which is about 33 percent of the Base Period average of 41.50 inches. The maximum monthly rainfall of 6.35 inches occurred in December, with 5.94 inches and 0.81 inches occurring during February and March, respectively. Figure 3-1 shows the seasonal precipitation from 1930-31 through 2008-09 and the accumulated departure from the 1930-31 through 1989-90 Base Period average. Seasonal rainfall within the Basin Area as measured at Victorville and Barstow totaled 4.08 inches and 3.13 inches, respectively. The amount recorded at Victorville represents approximately 74 percent of the annual average of 5.50 inches and the amount recorded at Barstow represents approximately 70 percent of the annual average of 4.49 inches. Figure 3-2 shows the seasonal precipitation at Victorville and Barstow.

Runoff During 2008-09

Locations of stream flow gages for the Mojave River system are shown on Appendix A. Table 3-1 shows monthly discharge amounts for 2008-09 at these locations.





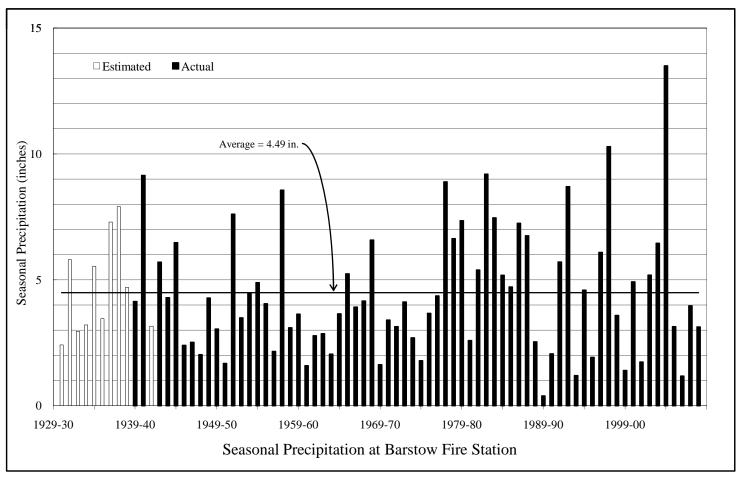

At the Forks

The total surface flow of the Mojave River at the Forks during 2008-09 as measured by the combined discharges of the West Fork Mojave River and Deep Creek was 30,912 acre-feet or about 47 percent of the Base Period average of 65,540 acre-feet. The combined discharges of the West Fork Mojave River and Deep Creek for the period 1930-31 through 2008-09 and the accumulated departure from the Base Period average are shown on Figure 3-3.

At Lower Narrows

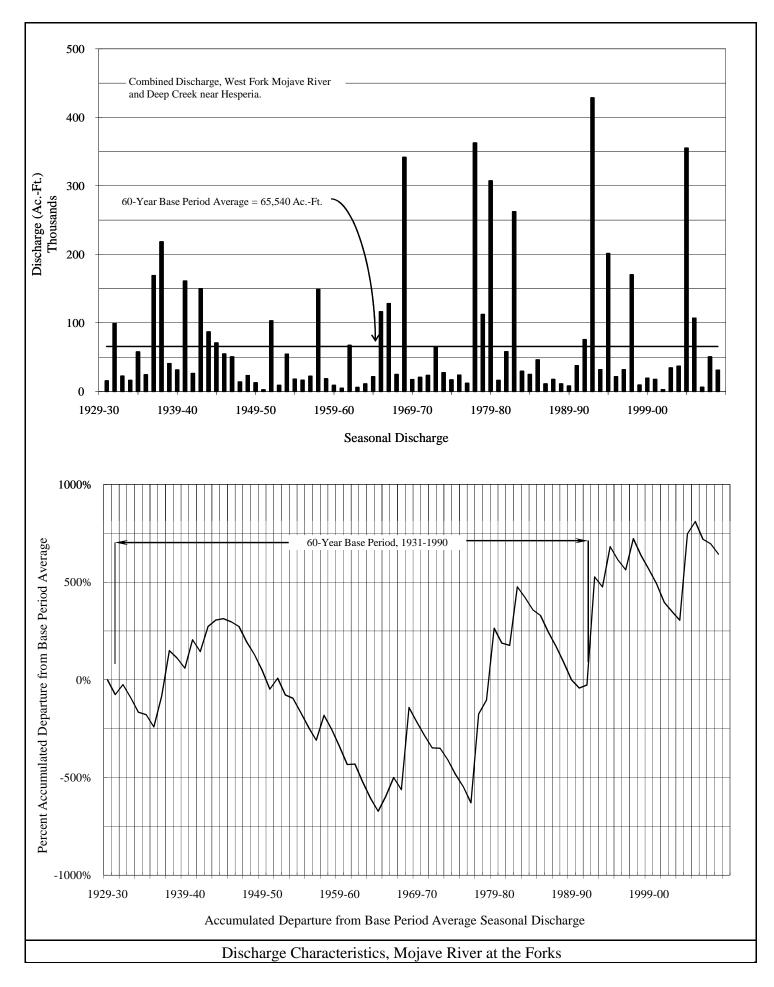
The total surface flow of the Mojave River at the Lower Narrows was 4,360 acre-feet, which is about 8.4 percent of the 60-Year Base Period average of 51,960 acre-feet. During Water Year 2008-09 the total flow accruing to the Lower Narrows Gage was estimated to consist of 267 acre-feet of storm flow and 4,093 acre-feet of base flow. Figure 3-4 shows the storm and base flow components of the total flow in the Mojave River at the Lower Narrows for the period 1930-31 through 2008-09.

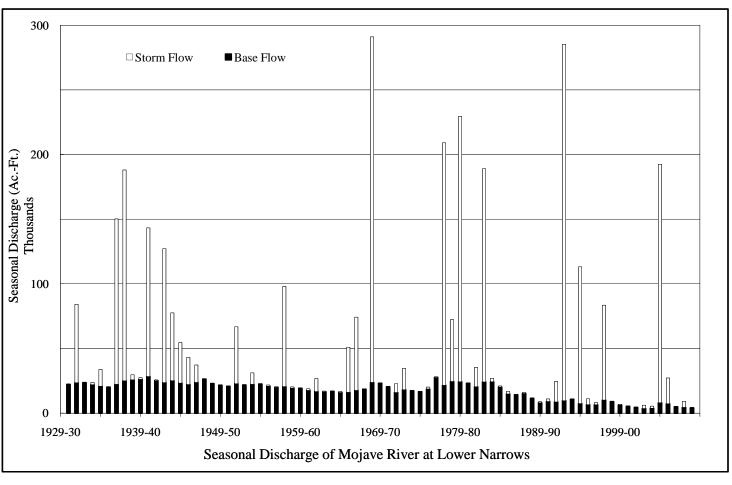
At Barstow

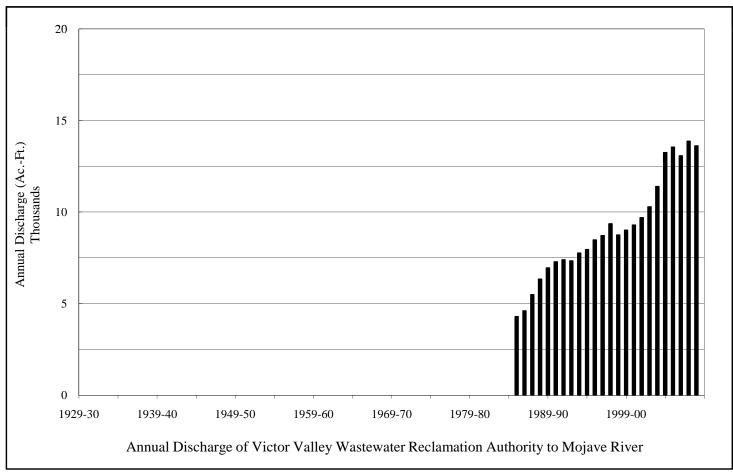

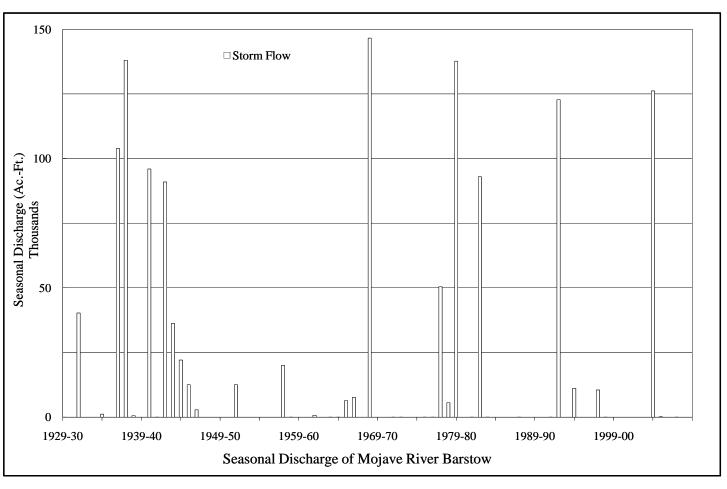
At Afton

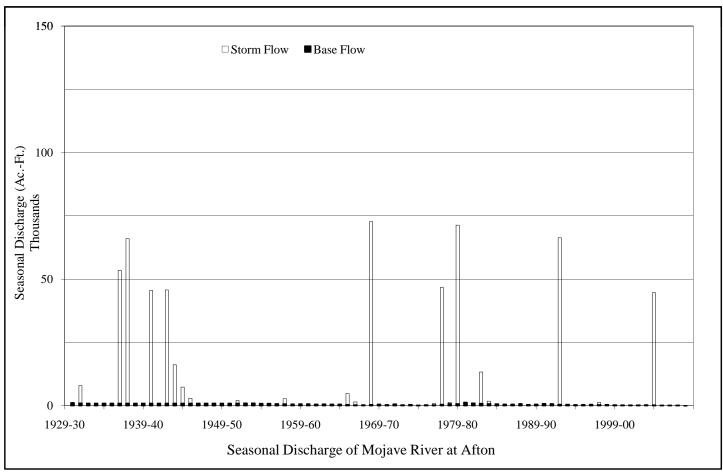
The total surface flow of the Mojave River at Afton was 112 acre-feet, which is about 1.4 percent of the Base Period average of 8,247 acre-feet. During 2008-09 the total flow accruing to the Afton Gage was estimated to consist of 7 acre-feet of storm flow and 105 acre-feet of base flow. Figure 3-5 shows the storm and base flow components of the total flow in the Mojave River at Afton for the period 1930-31 through 2008-09.

Victor Valley Wastewater Reclamation Authority Wastewater Effluent Discharges

The VVWRA delivers treated wastewater effluent to the Mojave River downstream from the Lower Narrows. This water is credited toward the Alto Subarea's Obligation to the Centro Subarea and amounted to 13,609 acre-feet for Water Year 2008-09. The annual wastewater effluent discharge to the Mojave River for the period 1985-86 through 2008-09 is shown on Figure 3-4.

Imported Water Deliveries by MWA

During 2008-09 MWA delivered 19,166 acre-feet of State Water Project water to the Alto, Centro and Baja Subareas.

Transition Zone Water Levels

The Judgment requires that minimum water levels be established in the Transition Zone primarily for the purpose of prioritizing recharge within the Alto Subarea. According to the Judgment, until minimum water levels are established, recharge of supplemental water must be delivered to the Transition Zone first, if there is a mandatory replacement obligation in the Transition Zone. Since entry of the Judgment there has not been a mandatory replacement obligation in the Transition Zone.

Watermaster submitted to the Court in April 2007, and the Court approved recommended water levels in the Transition Zone and a water level monitoring procedure as required by the Judgment.

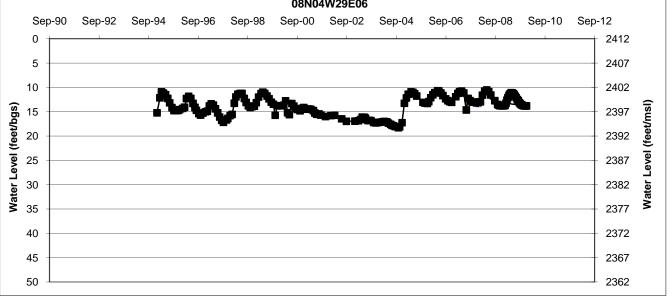
Figure 3-7 shows water levels in three wells near the Helendale Fault. Well number 08N04W20N01 & P02 provides historical reference for water levels dating back to 1930. The composite water level has changed nominally since 1930. Because this well has been discontinued, Watermaster proposes to monitor wells 08N04W19G04 and 08N04W29E06. Both of these wells indicate water level stability over the period of record (since 1994). Water level variation over a two year period exceeding 20 feet will be considered to have encroached on the minimum Transition Zone Water Levels and will require corrective measures. Water levels in this area were stable during the previous Water Year, and exhibit the same seasonal variation as the past 5 years.

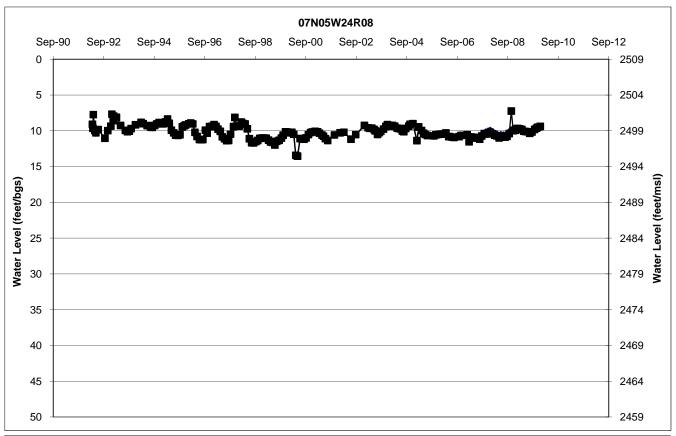
Figure 3-8 shows water levels in wells downstream from Victor Valley Wastewater Reclamation Authority's (VVWRA) point of discharge to the Mojave River. VVWRA

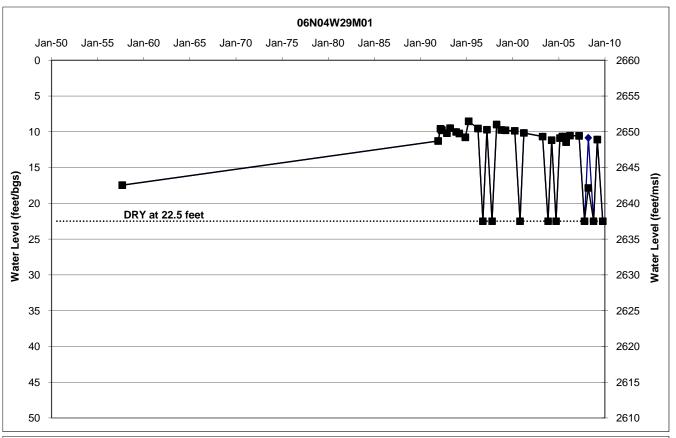
Figure 3-9 shows water levels in two shallow wells in the vicinity of the City of Adelanto's municipal water supply wells, and downstream of the United States Geological Survey (USGS) gage, "Mojave River at Lower Narrows near Victorville". These wells show seasonal variability but no long-term downward trend. The wells are of insufficient depth to measure the range of seasonal variation, however each year the water levels recover. Data in well 06N04W29M01 indicates that water levels have increased slightly since the mid 1950's; we note however that there is only one data point prior to 1991. MWA in cooperation with the California Department of Fish and Game installed a new monitoring well in this area in February 2008. After five years, data from the new well will be used to establish a minimum water level.

There are three areas within the Transition Zone that are to be evaluated annually. Water level data will be collected from wells in these areas and presented in the Watermaster's Annual Report to the Court. Well locations are shown on Figure 3-6. Water level hydrographs for Transition Zone wells are shown on Figures 3-7, 3-8 and 3-9.

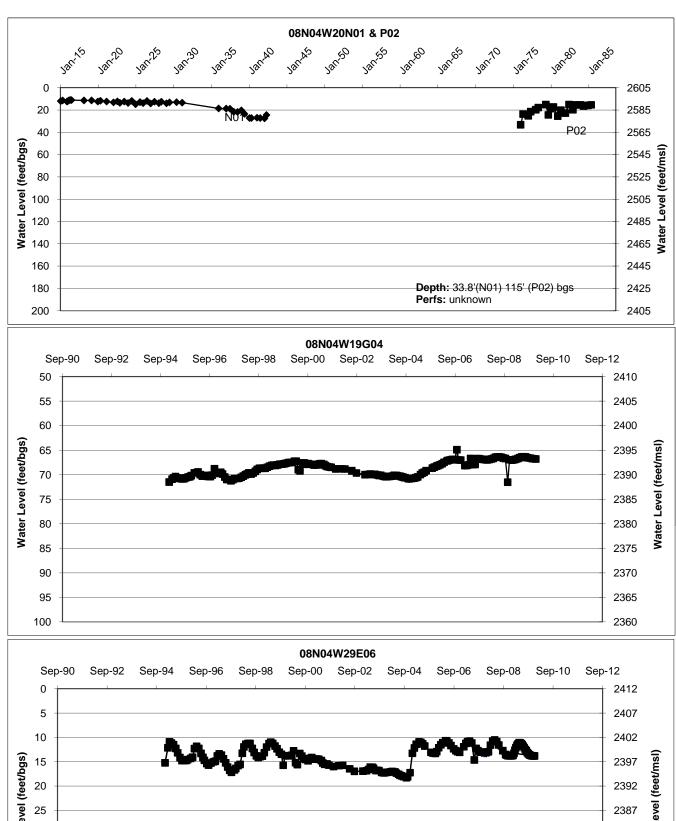
Water level data and the evaluation of groundwater gradient near the Helendale Fault showed that there has not been a change between the recent present and past. The stable water levels in the Transition Zone strongly suggest that the hydrologic relationship between Alto and Centro is relatively unchanged and that storms passing the Lower Narrows near Victorville continue on to Centro as envisioned by the Judgment.

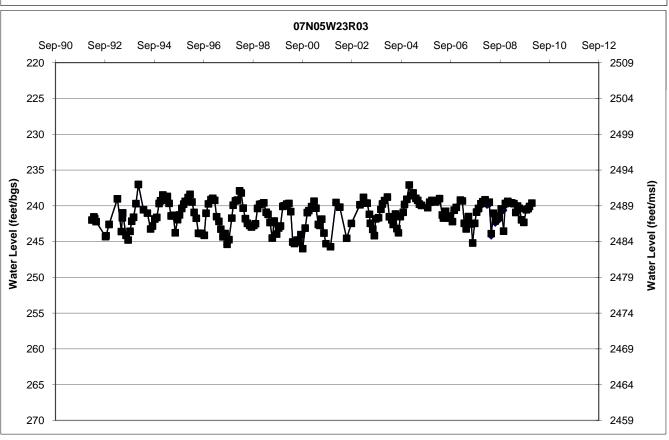
discharges in excess of 13,000 acre-feet per year which supports water levels within the Transition Zone. These water levels remained stable during Water Year 2008-09.

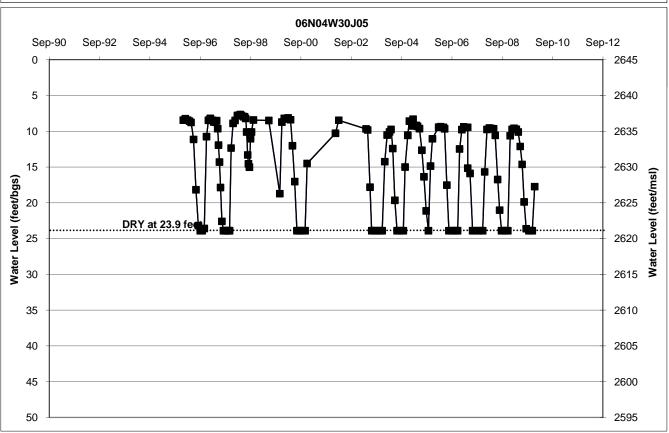












Subarea Water Levels

Water levels within each of the five Subareas were reviewed as part of the Watermaster's investigation into Subarea conditions and recommendations on Free Production Allowance. The Judgment does not specifically require that Watermaster consider changes in water levels in its investigation but Paragraph 24 (o) of the Judgment requires Watermaster to consider changes of water in storage. Rising and falling water levels within the Basin Area are indications of changes in storage over time. Annual changes in storage are indicated by Table 5-2. While the amount of water level data collected and maintained by MWA is extensive, it is not sufficient to determine changes in storage in each Subarea by using changes in water levels. However, the data is sufficient to make generalizations about the conditions in each Subarea.

The hydrographs were presented for inspection at the March 2010 Watermaster meeting and discussed in detail by the Engineer. Figures 3-10 through 3-16 are reduced copies of the exhibits available on the MWA website. A summary of the water levels for each Subarea is presented below.

Alto Subarea

Water levels in Alto are presented on three maps depicting hydrographs that represent conditions throughout Alto. 1) Western portion is generally west of the Mojave River (the river is included in the western portion); 2) Eastern portion is generally east of the Mojave River; and 3) Alto Transition Zone. Alto water levels near the river are relatively stable exhibiting seasonal variation, rising in winter and falling in summer. The near river wells also indicate rising and falling water levels consistent with available recharge from storms. It is expected that under current pumping conditions and long term precipitation that near river wells will remain stable. Water levels in the western portion of Alto in the regional aquifer exhibit declines consistent with locally heavy pumping and limited local recharge. Water levels in the eastern portion of

Alto indicate similar trends although to a lesser extent; most likely due to limited pumping in the regional aquifer east of the river. Continued pumping in depleted areas of the regional system may result in long local negative impacts such as declining yields and water quality problems. Watermaster is not aware of wide spread problems in the regional system due to the falling water table. The relative stability of near river water levels and water levels in the Transition Zone indicate hydrologic stability in the relationship between Alto and the downstream Subareas.

Baja Subarea

Baja water levels continue to decline due to over pumping and limited recharge opportunities. Wells near the river in the Daggett area respond to recharge when it is available but continue to fall immediately following storm events. Water levels in the area near the river at Camp Cady indicate relative stability due to water perched in the shallow aquifer, limited pumping and geologic factors such as narrowing of the basin sediments near Camp Cady and downstream. Water levels elsewhere in Baja show declines without indicating recovery after storms.

Centro Subarea

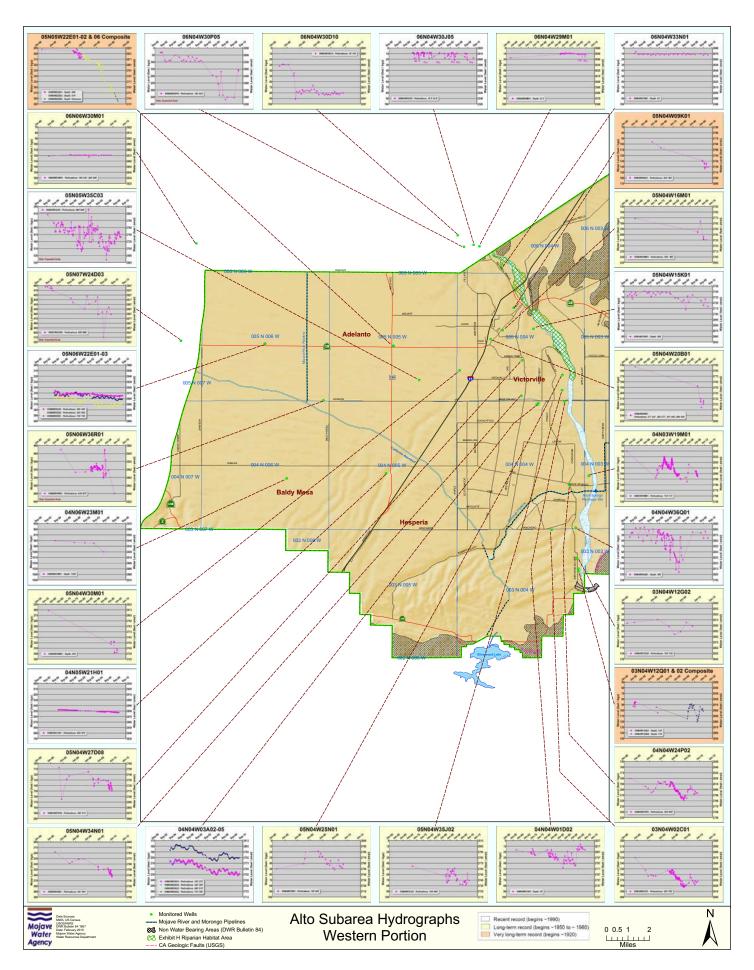
Water levels in Centro have been stable showing seasonal variability and variability during dry years but generally recover during wet periods. Water levels in the Harper Lake area indicate a slow recovery due primarily to cessation of pumping during the past several years. Water levels in wells in the vicinity of Hinkley but away from the river system show the effects of pumping and limited recharge.

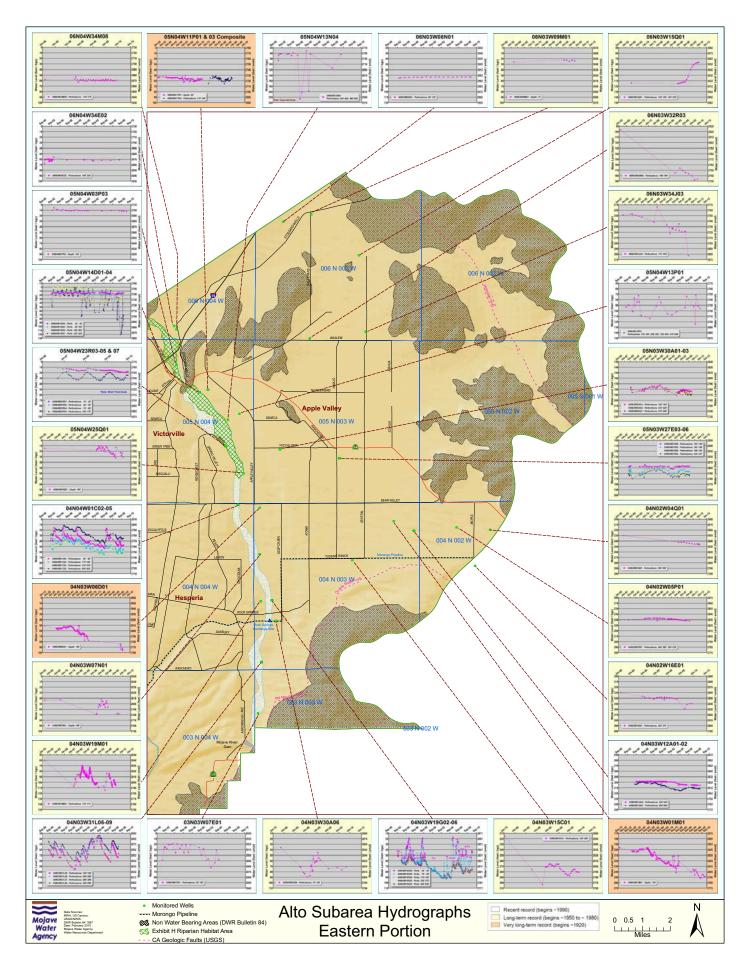
Este Subarea

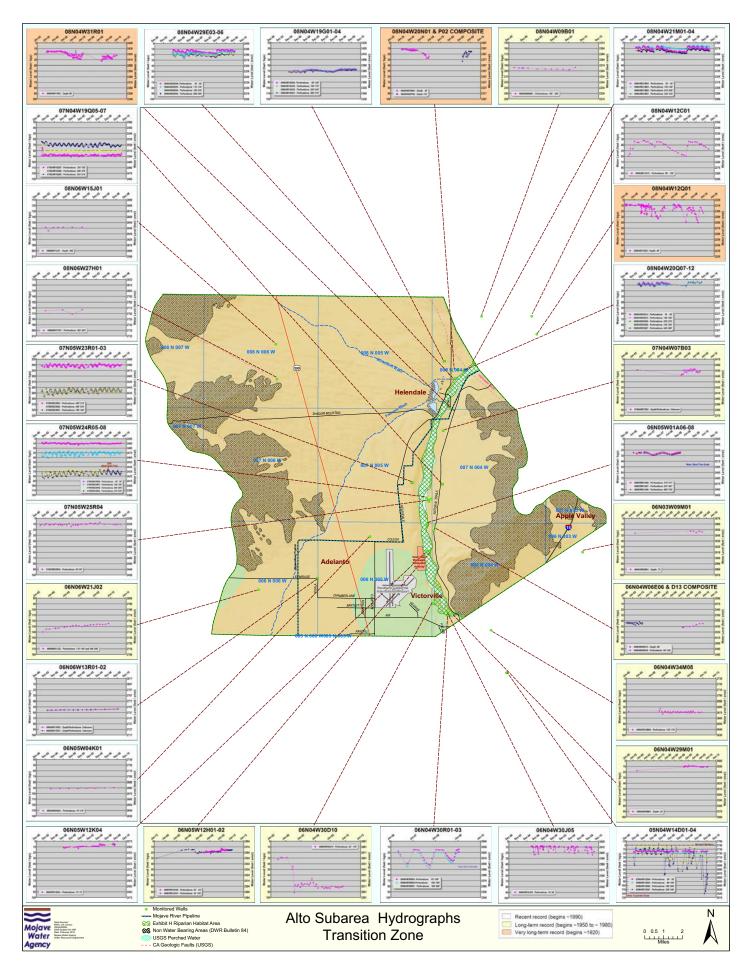
Water levels in Este have remained stable for the past several years indicating a relative balance between recharge and discharge.

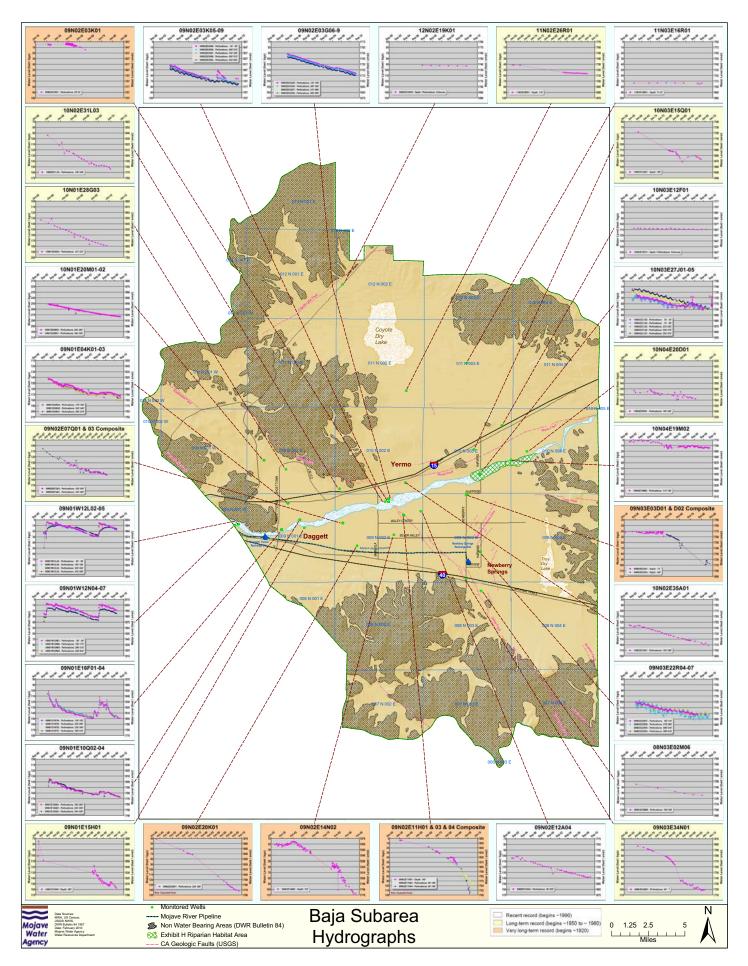
Oeste Subarea

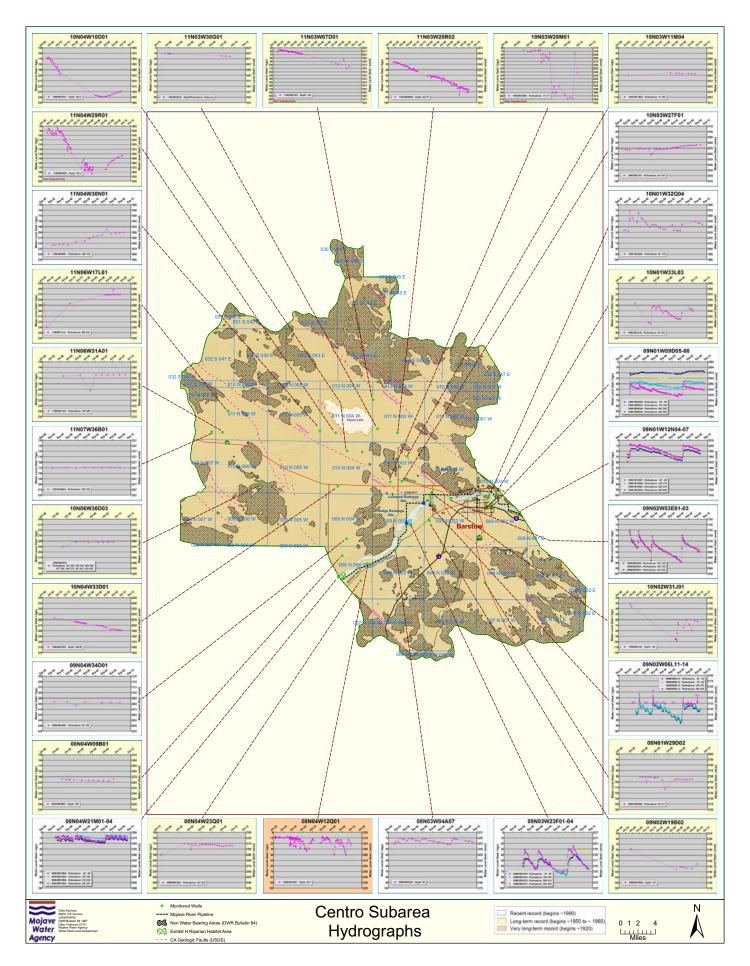
Oeste water levels continue to decline and in some areas the declines are significant. Water levels are declining in wells in Los Angeles County near the Phelan Piñon Hills CSD municipal water supply well used to supply water to the CSD's customers in San Bernardino County. Water levels near Sheep Creek Road and Highway 18 indicate significant decline, likely due to heavy pumping nearby. Water levels in the north part of Oeste near El Mirage indicate relative stability. It should be noted that the available water level data in Oeste is limited.

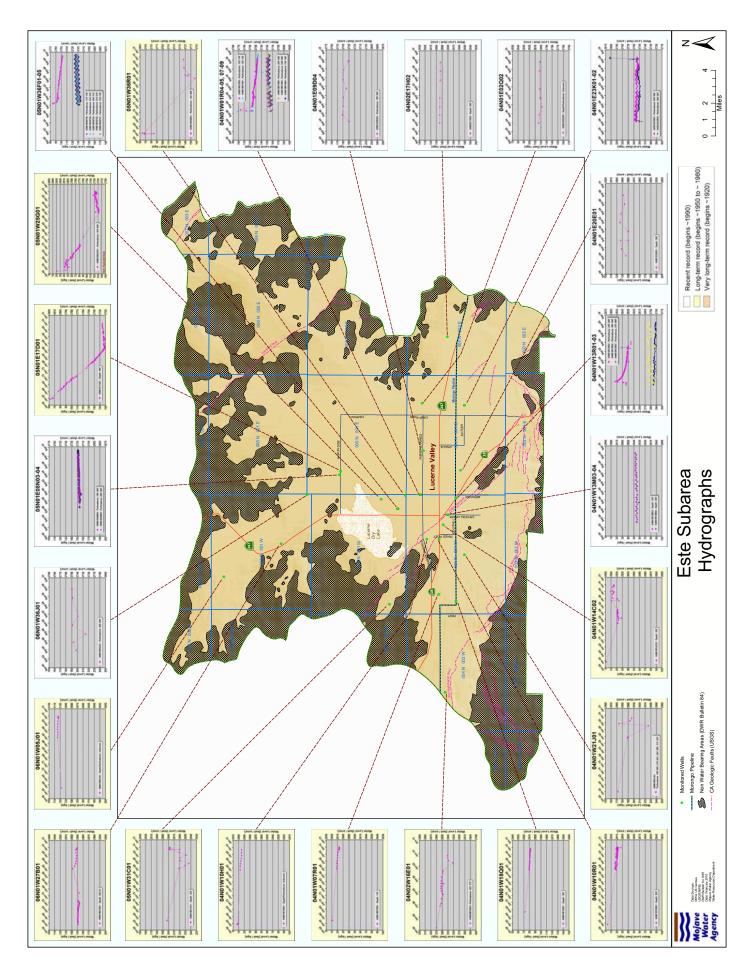


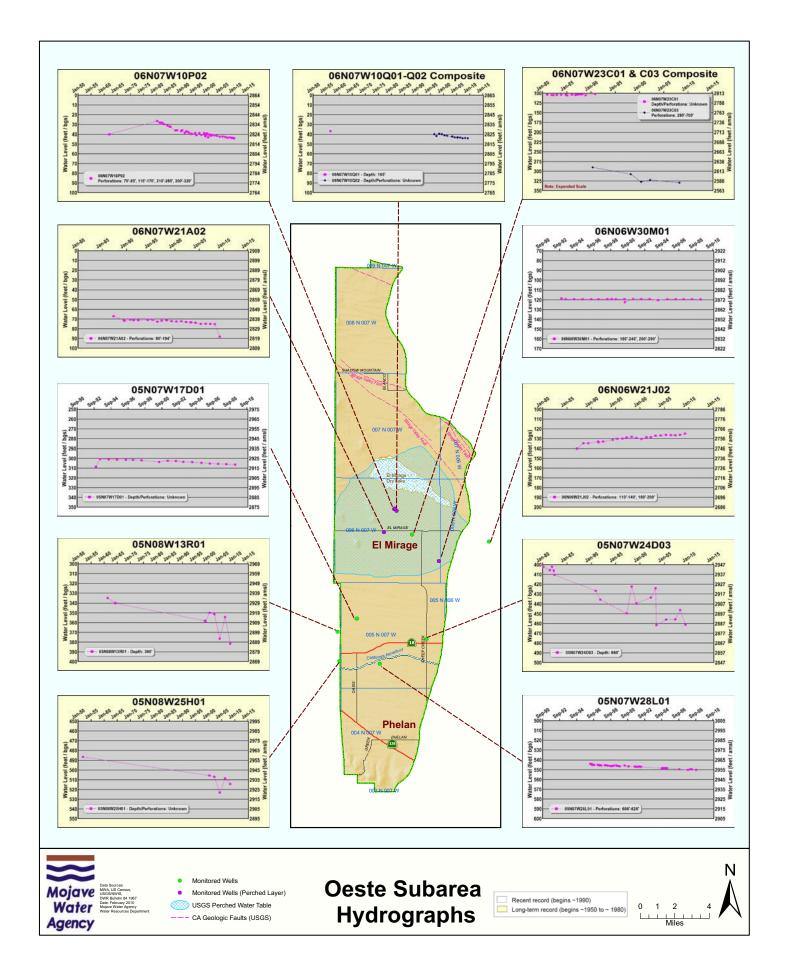












CHAPTER 4

STATUS OF REPLACEMENT WATER AND MAKEUP WATER OBLIGATIONS

Appendix B summarizes each Producer's Replacement Water and Makeup Water Obligations as well as any related assessments due and payable by July 1, 2010.

Replacement Water

Each Producer's Replacement Water Obligation in each Subarea was calculated by subtracting that Producer's 2008-09 share of FPA (plus any transferred or carryover FPA) from that Producer's verified production in 2008-09. Each Producer's Replacement Water Assessment was calculated by multiplying that Producer's Replacement Water Obligation by the 2008-09 Replacement Water Assessment Rate of \$386.00 per acre-foot. In lieu of paying Replacement Water Assessments, a Producer may satisfy a Replacement Water Obligation in a Subarea by acquiring another Producer's Unused FPA from 2008-09 in the same Subarea (subject to any consumptive use adjustments) and reporting such acquisition to the Watermaster on appropriate forms provided by the Watermaster not later than 30 days prior to the regularly scheduled Watermaster Meeting in May 2010. Unused FPA during 2008-09 for each Producer within each Subarea is set forth in Appendix B.

Table 4-1 summarizes the Replacement Water Obligations and Assessments and Unused FPA for 2008-09 in each Subarea.

Makeup Water

The Base Flow determination of 4,093 acre-feet prepared by the Watermaster Engineer was presented to the Watermaster at the regularly scheduled meeting January 27, 2010. Table 4-2 summarizes the flows credited to each Subarea obligation during Water Year 2008-09, the status of each Subarea at the end of the year and each minimum obligation for Water Year 2008-09. The Makeup Obligation from the Alto Subarea to the Centro Subarea for Water Year 2008-09 is 3,074 acre-feet. Table 4-3 shows the year over year Makeup Obligation from Alto to Centro beginning in Water Year 1999-00.

During the first ten years of implementation of the Judgment, the subsurface flow obligations between Subareas were assumed to be met. Subsequently, Watermaster revisited the subsurface flow assumptions in the Judgment and recommended no changes. Subject to continued monitoring, the Makeup Obligations are assumed to be met.

Un-met Replacement and Makeup Water Obligations

The Supreme Court opinion relieving the Cardozo Appellants of any assessments levied pursuant to the Judgment resulted in 82.69 acre-feet of "un-met" Makeup Obligation from the Alto Subarea to the Centro Subarea and 473 acre-feet of Replacement Obligation in the Centro Subarea. Additionally, a recent court ordered settlement with the Vernola Trust resulted in an un-met Replacement Obligation in Centro of 751 acre-feet. The Baja Subarea has 240 acre-feet of Replacement Obligation that is "un-met" due to uncollectable assessments. Associated Administrative and Biological assessments were also not collected in these instances. Details regarding uncollectable assessments are kept on file at the Watermaster's office. The table below shows the cumulative "un-met" Replacement and Makeup Water Obligations since entry of Judgment.

CHAPTER 5

FREE PRODUCTION ALLOWANCE FOR WATER YEAR 2010-11

Pursuant to paragraph 24 (o) of the Judgment After Trial dated January 10, 1996, the Watermaster is required to make a recommendation to the Court for adjusting the FPA of each Subarea, if necessary.

Exhibit H of the Judgment provides that in the event that the FPA exceeds the estimated Production Safe Yield (PSY) by five percent or more (of the Subarea BAP), Watermaster shall recommend a reduction in FPA equal to a full five percent of the aggregate Subarea BAP.

The Watermaster determined that 1996-97 was an appropriate baseline year to use to update the elements of Table C-1 from the Judgment (see page 36). During the 1998-99 Water Year, the Watermaster retained the engineering firm of Albert A. Webb Associates of Riverside (Webb) to conduct a consumptive water use study as required by the Judgment. The results of the Webb study are summarized in Table 5-1. Watermaster has also prepared an estimate of current consumptive use assuming the demands in 2008-09 are representative of long-term cultural conditions. This estimate is shown on Table 5-2 for comparison.

The following table shows the current FPA for each Subarea and the estimated PSY based on the consumptive use analysis provided by Albert A. Webb in February 2000. Also shown is the verified production for Water Year 2008-09.

Free Production Allowance as shown above is greater than Production Safe Yield by more than 5% in four of the five Subareas. The Court directed Watermaster to develop Rampdown alternatives that were implemented for Water Year 2002-03. Given the constraints

imposed by the Judgment and direction from the Court regarding Rampdown, it is recommended that FPA be set as follows for each Subarea for Water Year 2010-11.

<u>Subarea</u> <u>2010-11 FPA Recommendation</u>

Alto – Agriculture 80% of Base Annual Production

Alto – Municipal & Industrial 60% of Base Annual Production

Baja 65% of Base Annual Production

Centro 80% of Base Annual Production

Este¹ 80% of Base Annual Production

Oeste – Agriculture 80% of Base Annual Production Oeste – Municipal & Industrial 70% of Base Annual Production

- 1. FPA to be set at 80% of Base Annual Production for the 2010-11 Water Year. The Este Subarea may be subject to future Rampdown to 65% immediately if water use conditions change.
- 2. FPA to be set at 70% of Base Annual Production for the 2010-11 Water Year subject to continued Rampdown. Implementation will be held in abeyance for 4 years (starting in the 2009-10 Water Year) at 80% subject to court approval.

Alto – 60% of BAP for M&I 80% of BAP for Agriculture

It is recommended that FPA in Alto remain unchanged. Alto producers purchased 18,173 acre-feet of Replacement Water in 2009 for obligations incurred in 2008. Water Production in Alto declined by 4,170 acre-feet in 2008-09 from 2007-08. FPA is within 5% of PSY. Rampdown in Alto is not warranted at this time.

Baja – 65% of BAP

Pursuant to the Judgment additional Rampdown in Baja is warranted. Free Production Allowance exceeds the PSY and current water production and consumptive use exceeds the average net long-term supply in Baja. The continued overdraft in Baja will cause continued depletion of water from storage.

Pursuant to the Judgment, FPA exceeds PSY by more than 5% of BAP indicating additional Rampdown to 62.5% is required (Exhibit H). We note that water production in Baja during 2008-09 declined from 2007-08 by 13.61%. Water production has declined about 20% in the past two years, however, water levels continue to decline.

Last year, after consideration of information provided by Watermaster, DFG, and Baja producers, the Court imposed a 2.5% Rampdown. We evaluated the effects on storage depletion of a 2.5% Rampdown and a 5% Rampdown as part of Watermaster's submittal to the Court. We have made a similar evaluation below.

A graph showing the year when replacement water would be purchased by Baja producers if water production was unchanged in the future from the current levels, and Rampdown was implemented at 2.5% and at 5% was presented to Watermaster. As indicated no aggregate replacement obligation will be purchased by Baja until 2019, or in nine years at a 5% Rampdown. At 2.5% Rampdown, no aggregate replacement water will be purchased until 2024 or in 14 years. In both cases water will be removed from storage to satisfy demands.

Assuming a Rampdown of 5% per year through 2019, about 150,000 acre-feet of storage will be depleted. Assuming a Rampdown of 2.5% per year through 2024, about 225,000 acre-feet will be depleted. We note that storage depletion of approximately 150,000 acre-feet may still occur under both Rampdown scenarios over the next 9 years if pumping remains unchanged. By using the available carryover allowance and excess Free Production Allowance, through transfers, as allowed by the Judgment, replacement water obligations can be satisfied without buying supplemental water.

Last year, the California Department of Fish and Game (DFG) requested that a 5% Rampdown be implemented pursuant to the terms of the Judgment. DFG has responsibility to protect public trust resources and in particular has a direct interest in Baja at Camp Cady. DFG has stated its intent to preserve and restore the habitat at Camp Cady. As indicated, above, regardless of whether the Rampdown amount is 5% or 2.5% there will be continued depletion from storage.

From a regional hydrologic perspective there is no difference between a Rampdown at 5% or 2.5% for the next nine years, assuming water production is relatively constant (roughly equal to or less than the historical average). At some point it will be necessary for Baja to either buy water, reduce pumping or change land uses to a much lower consumptive use. Watermaster has informed by the Baja Subarea Advisory Committee that the Baja community water supply is at risk over time from continued storage depletion. Watermaster provided details of the risk to specific classes of wells in its motion last year.

Preservation and restoration at Camp Cady are goals of DFG. To the extent that the current health of the habitat there is dependent on reducing pumping stresses throughout the Baja

Subarea, conditions will not change significantly until the pumping stresses are changed. The Judgment will act to stabilize water levels but not cause water levels to rise. As such, DFG's goals in the short-term are not compromised by a 2.5% Rampdown any more than they are improved by a 5% Rampdown (over the next nine years).

We believe that the Judgment requires a recommendation to reduce FPA in Baja by 5%. However, based on the foregoing analysis we believe that a 2.5% reduction in FPA, consistent with the Court's order for last Water Year is a reasonable alternative. DFG has indicated that it will support that recommendation subject to certain limitations, outlined in a letter to Watermaster dated March 16, 2010. Watermaster believes that the DFG recommendation is consistent with Watermaster's. We note that DFG's preference regarding Rampdown is 5% per year, however, it is accepting the 2.5% per year for 5 years as an alternative. We also note that Watermaster will continue to evaluate and report on water supply conditions in Baja on an annual basis as required by the Judgment.

It is recommended that FPA in Baja be set at 65% and reduced 2.5% per year for the next four years.

Centro – 80% of BAP

Watermaster recommends that FPA in Centro be left at 80% of BAP. There is a slight surplus in Centro as measured against the long-term average water supply. Water levels in wells in areas of heavy pumping around Barstow show a greater downward trend than other wells during periods of below average water supply but in the past have recovered during periods of storm flow. Although FPA exceeds the PSY in Centro, further Rampdown would be unnecessary given the fact that there is an apparent surplus when considering the long-term average water supply and current levels of pumping. Watermaster will re-evaluate conditions in Centro annually and may recommend Rampdown in the future.

Este – 80% of BAP

Water levels remain relatively stable in Este. We are continuing data collection and analysis and recommend that FPA in Este remain at 80% and the Court ordered stay on Rampdown remain in effect. Any material increases in water production or changing conditions could result in an immediate Rampdown in Este to 65% or lower following further hearings with

the Court. Water production in Este has not changed significantly since Este Rampdown was stayed in 2002. Water production in Este declined 16.91% from 2007-08.

Oeste – 80% of BAP for Agriculture 70% of BAP for M&I (stayed at 80% Subject to Court Order)

A review of available water level data in Oeste indicates a downward trend in recent water levels, particularly in areas near municipal pumping. Water production in Oeste declined 6.78% from 2007-08. FPA also exceeds PSY by more than 5% of BAP. Phelan Piñon Hills CSD's (PPHCSD) pumping immediately adjacent to San Bernardino County but from a well in Los Angeles County could be impacting the water supply to Oeste. Water levels in two wells (05N08W25H01 and 13R01) which are about 2 miles north of the PPHCSD's Los Angeles County production well, are falling, 05N08W25H01 has declined about 25 feet and 05N08W13R01 has declined about 45 feet since 1950 since 1950. Water levels in both wells declined in the last year. Water levels in a production well (05N07W24D03) located near Sheep Creek road and Highway 18 have declined almost 60 feet since 1980. Verified water production exceeds PSY by 23.4%. PPHCSD pumped about 400 acre-feet from its Los Angeles County well in 2008-09. This amount was about equal to the pumping reduction reported by PPHCSD. Some water pumped in Oeste is used in Alto and may return to the Alto groundwater system. The distribution of return flow may have changed since it was last evaluated and may also affect the water supply conditions in Oeste.

Last year the Court adopted Watermaster's recommendation, as requested by PPHCSD, to reduce FPA for M&I producers, 5% per year for 4 years but stay implementation. We recommend that Oeste FPA be set at 70% of BAP for M&I and 80% for Agriculture for 2010-11 and a continuation of the stay allowing PPHCSD to produce water at 80% of BAP.

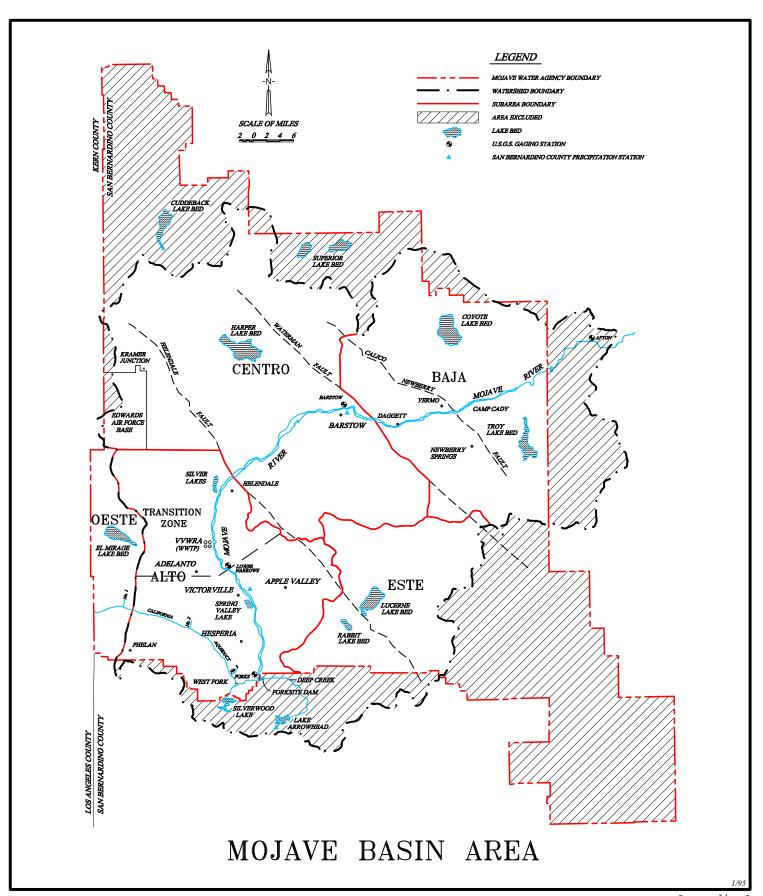

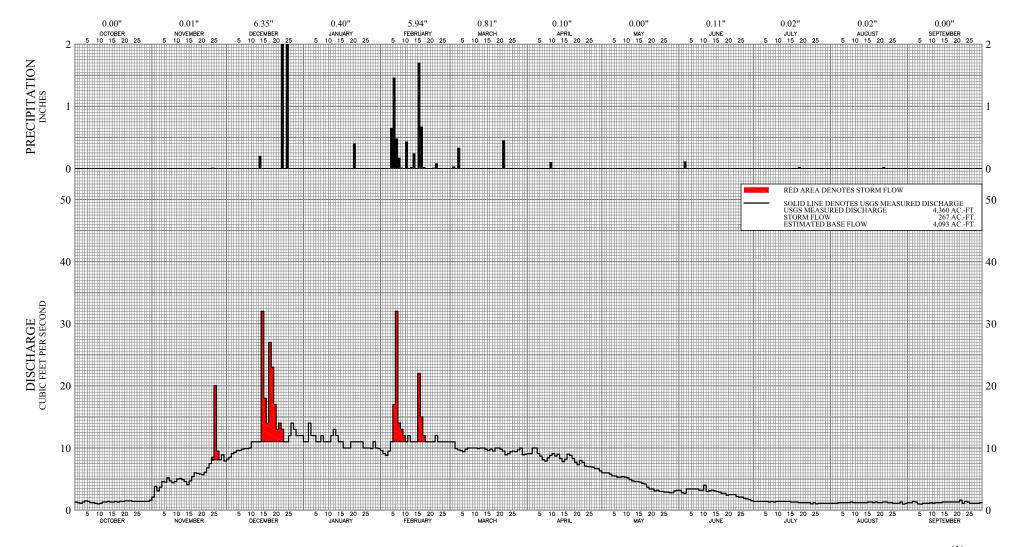

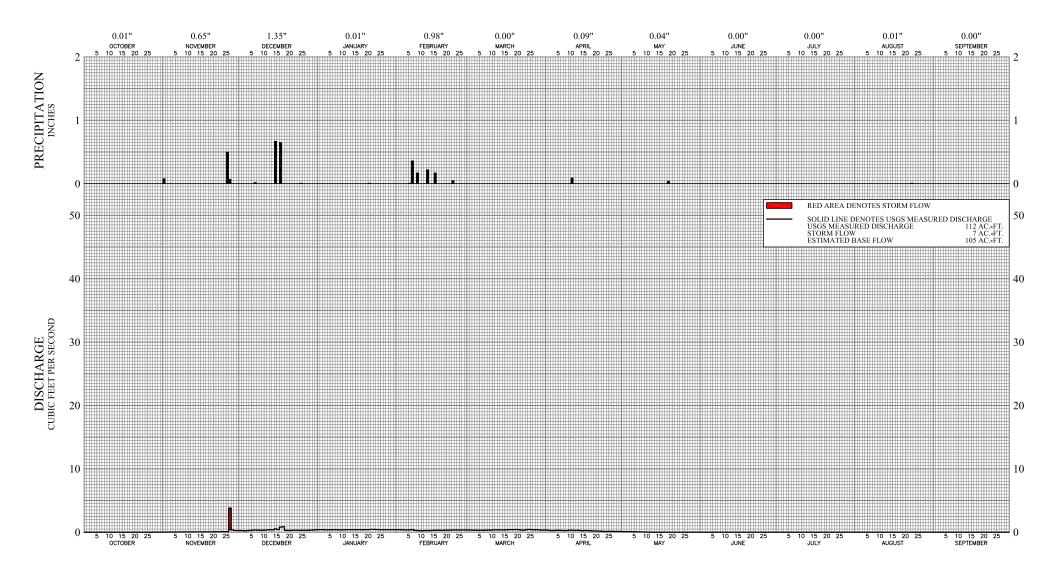

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the Mojave Basin Area Watermaster ("Watermaster"), a component unit of the Mojave Water Agency, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2009, as listed in the table of contents. These financial statements are the responsibility of the management of the Watermaster. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. The prior year partial comparative information has been derived from the Watermaster's financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2008 which were audited by Messner & Hadley, LLP and whose report dated September 30, 2008 expressed an unqualified opinion on those financial statements.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Watermaster as of June 30, 2009, and the changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The information identified in the accompanying table of contents as *management's discussion* and analysis is not a required part of the basic financial statements, but is supplementary information required by accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. We have applied certain limited procedures, which consisted principally of inquiries of management regarding the methods of measurement and presentation of the required supplementary information. However, we did not audit the information and express no opinion on it.

In accordance with Government Auditing Standards, we have also issued our report dated January 12, 2010 on our consideration of the Watermaster's internal control over financial reporting and our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts,

THE ORGANIZATION

Mojave Basin Area Watermaster (the "Watermaster") was organized September 23, 1993, to administer a judgment by the Superior Court of the State of California for the County of Riverside. The Judgment divided the Mojave Basin into five distinct but hydrologically interrelated sub-areas named for the Spanish words describing their respective locations in the basin: *Este, Oeste, Alto, Centro, and Baja*. Because the Court found each of these sub-areas to be in overdraft – a condition in which more water is pumped than is naturally replenished – it developed a plan, known as "the Judgment", to manage the water resources of the entire basin.

To maintain proper water balances between the sub-areas, the Judgment established a decreasing free production allowance (FPA) in each sub-area during the first five years of the plan, with a provision for the Court to review and adjust the FPA annually thereafter. Each water producer's share of the FPA in a sub-area was determined by verifying the maximum annual production, or base annual production (BAP), for each producer during a five-year base period, 1986-1990. This data was compiled for each sub-area and each producer's share of the sub-area's total was calculated. The Judgment requires that producers who pump more than their FPA's replace the excess water. Replacement of excess water can be accomplished by paying the Watermaster for future replacement of the water, or by purchasing the unused FPA of another producer by mutual agreement.

In addition to establishing a policy for the over-pumping of underground water, the Judgment also established a policy for the over-usage of water determined by a measurement of the flow of surface water in the Mojave River. Upstream users deemed to be responsible for a decrease in the surface flow reaching downstream users are assessed a make-up charge. Make-up charges are assessed to producers in a sub-area based upon their percentage shares in the sub-area's overall FPA.

The Watermaster is responsible for monitoring, verifying production, reporting to the Court, collecting assessments and conducting studies. All producers stipulating to the Judgment are assessed a quarterly administrative fee to offset some of the expense incurred by the Watermaster in executing its responsibilities. Besides the replacement, make-up, and administrative fees, producers are charged a fee for environmental protection.

THE BASIC FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Judgment described above appointed Mojave Water Agency (the "Agency") as the initial Watermaster. This means that while the management of the Watermaster issues the separate financial statements included here, the Watermaster's financial statements are also included in the financial statements of Mojave Water Agency as a component unit.

The accompanying financial statements are presented in the format prescribed for proprietary funds by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB). They consist of three interrelated statements designed to provide the reader with relevant, understandable data about the Organization's financial condition and operating results. These are the statement of net

assets, statement of revenues, expenses and changes in net assets, and the statement of cash flows.

The statement of net assets presents the Organization's assets and liabilities and the difference, or net, between what is owned and what is owed as of the last day of the Organization's fiscal year. The statement of revenues, expenses and changes in net assets describes the financial results of the Organization's operations for the year reported. These results, or changes in net assets, are the increases or decreases in the bottom line of the statement of net assets.

The statement of cash flows conveys to financial statement users how the Organization managed cash resources during the year. This statement converts the change in net assets presented on the statement of revenues, expenses and changes in net assets into actual cash provided by and used for operations. The statement of cash flows also details how the Organization obtains cash through financing and investing activities, and how cash is spent for these purposes.

Operating income improved over fiscal year ending June 30, 2008 by approximately \$350k. While water sales went down \$1.5 million, water purchases went down by \$1.8 million. During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, the Watermaster changed the timing for setting rates, thereby able to collect rates closer to the actual cost of replacement water. In addition, revenues from water sold in Oeste remains with the Watermaster in the restricted net assets, since Mojave Water Agency currently does not have a recharge site in Oeste to replenish the groundwater. When water is able to be recharged, the funds held by the Watermaster will be used for replacement water in Oeste.

CATEGORIES OF NET ASSETS

The Watermaster is required to present its net assets in three categories: (1) invested in capital assets, (2) restricted, and (3) unrestricted. Since all assets of the Watermaster are either restricted for use or a small amount is invested in capital assets, only those two categories are reported.

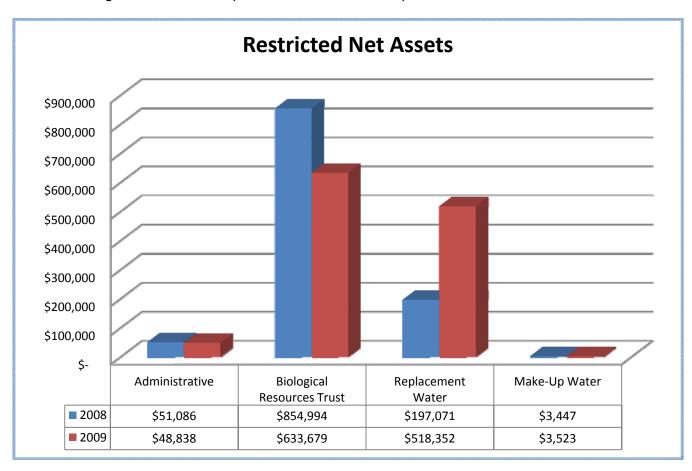
Invested in Capital Assets

During the year ended June 30, 2009, the Watermaster had current year depreciation of \$5,598. Total capital assets, net of accumulated depreciation, equal \$15,762, an increase of \$6,089 over the prior year.

Restricted Net Assets

The Watermaster's restricted net assets consist of net assets restricted for a Biological Resources Trust Fund, Watermaster Administrative costs, Replacement Water and Make-up Water. The sources that feed each of these funds is dictated by the Judgment and uses of these funds can only be used for the purposes stated in the Judgment.

During the year ended June 30, 2009, the Biological Resources Trust fund declined by approximately \$220k, due to the payment to the Mojave Water Agency for work on the Invasive Species Project (approved by the Department of Fish and Game). Replacement water continues to increase this year due to the collection of Replacement Water obligations for the Oeste subarea. As stated earlier, recharge facilities in Oeste are currently not in place, therefore money received for replacement obligations in that sub-area will remain with the Watermaster until such time as recharge or other water replacement facilities are in place.

NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Financial Reporting Entity

Mojave Water Agency (the "Agency") was organized July 21, 1960 by an act of the legislature of the State of California known as the Mojave Water Agency Act. Within the limits of its power and authority set forth in this act, the purpose of the Agency is to do any and every act necessary to be done so that sufficient water may be available for any present or future beneficial use of the lands and inhabitants of the Agency, including, but not limited to, the construction, maintenance, alteration, purchase, and operation of any and all works or improvements within the Agency necessary or proper to carry out any object or purpose of this act; and the gathering of data for, and the development and implementation of, after consultation and coordination with all public and private water entities who are in any way affected, management and master plans to mitigate the cumulative overdraft of groundwater basins, to monitor the condition of the groundwater basins, to pursue all necessary water conservation measures, and to negotiate for additional water supplies from all state, federal, and other sources. In 1994, the Agency became the court appointed Mojave Basin Area Watermaster (the "Watermaster"). A requirement of the judgment is to provide audited financial statements of the Watermaster to the court.

1963 Feather River Water – The Agency signed a contract with the State of California Department of Water Resources for the delivery of Feather River water to secure a supply of supplemental water for the Agency.

1994 Mojave Basin Area Watermaster – The Agency was appointed by the Superior Court of Riverside as the initial Watermaster in the Mojave River Basin Area groundwater adjudication. The Agency staff functions as administrative staff for the Watermaster. The seven directors of the Watermaster are also board members of Mojave Water Agency. Under this arrangement, Mojave Basin Area Watermaster (the "Watermaster") is considered and presented as a blended component unit of the Agency.

1994 – 1995 Groundwater Recharge Facilities – Additional groundwater recharge facilities, funded by loans from the California Department of Water Resources, were completed.

1995 Morongo Basin Pipeline Project – The Agency completed its first major transmission and distribution facility to Yucca Valley, California, known as the Morongo Basin Pipeline Project. The project, in the form of Improvement District "M", was approved by voter referendum in June of 1990. It was funded by general obligation bonds issued in 1991 and 1992, which were defeased by general obligation bonds issued in 1996.

1996 – The Agency acquired 25,000 acre-feet of additional capacity in the state water project facilities within the California Aqueduct.

1997 Mojave Water Agency Public Facilities Corporation – The Corporation (PFC) was formed to provide financial assistance to the Agency. The seven directors of the PFC are also board members of Mojave Water Agency. Under this arrangement, the PFC is considered and presented as a blended component unit of the Agency.

MOJAVE BASIN AREA WATERMASTER NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Year Ended June 30, 2009

2000 Mojave River Pipeline Project – The Agency completed portions of its second major transmission and distribution facility to Barstow, California and beyond, known as the Mojave River Pipeline Project. The project was partially funded by grants and loans from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the California Department of Water Resources.

B. Basis of Presentation, Measurement Focus, and Financial Statement Disclosure

The basic financial statements, which include the Statements of Net Assets, the Statements of Activities and Changes in Net Assets, and the Statement of Cash Flows, report information on only the Watermaster enterprise activities of the Agency. The full financial statements of the Watermaster as a whole are presented in accordance with Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement No. 34, Basic Financial Statements, Management's Discussion & Analysis, for State & Local governments & related standards.

The Agency and Watermaster report their respective activities as enterprise funds which are used to account for operations that are financed and operated in a manner similar to business enterprises, where the intent of providing goods and services to the general public on a continuing basis be financed or recovered primarily through user charges.

The basic financial statements are prepared using the "economic resource" measurement focus and the accrual basis of accounting. Accordingly, all assets and liabilities (whether current or non-current) are included on the Statement of Net Assets. The Statement of Activities and Changes in Net Assets presents increases (revenues) and decreases (expenses) in total net assets. Under the accrual basis of accounting, revenues are recognized in the period in which they are earned while expenses are recognized in the period in which the liability is incurred.

The Agency and Watermaster distinguish its respective operating revenues and expenses from non-operating items. Operating revenues and expenses generally result from providing services and delivering water in connection with the Agency's and Watermaster's respective principal ongoing operations. The principal operating revenues of the Agency are water sales to the Watermaster. The principal operating revenues of the Watermaster are water sales to member water right holders. Operating expenses include the cost of sales and services, administrative expenses, and depreciation on capital assets. All revenues and expenses not meeting this definition are reported as non-operating revenues and expenses. Capital contributions, non-operating revenues, are reported as a separate line item in the Statement of Activities and Changes in Net Assets.

The financial statements of the Watermaster are prepared and presented in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America for proprietary funds of governmental entities. The Watermaster applies all applicable Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) pronouncements as well as any Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) statements and interpretations, Accounting Principles Board opinions and Accounting Research Bulletin's issued on or before November 30, 1989, unless those pronouncements conflict with or contradict GASB pronouncements. The financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting and the economic resources measurement focus.

C. Major Fund

The **Watermaster Fund** is a fund that was established as part of the judgment that was the result of an adjudication process over a water rights dispute (*City of Barstow, et al. vs. City of Adelanto, et al.,* Case No. 208568). The judgment requires an annual fiscal report of all activities of the Watermaster, as well as establishing the types of fees the Watermaster may impose and the powers of the Watermaster. The primary revenue sources of this fund are water sales and charges imposed upon users of water in the groundwater basin. The primary activities of this fund are activities associated with the regulation and production of water associated with the Mojave groundwater basin.

D. Assets and Liabilities

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Watermaster's cash and cash equivalents are considered to be cash on hand, demand deposits, cash management pools, and highly liquid investments with original maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition.

In accordance with GASB Statement No. 40, Deposit and Investment Disclosures (Amendment of GASB No. 3), certain disclosure requirements for Deposits and Investment Risks were made in the following areas:

- Interest Rate Risk
- Credit Risk
- Overall
- Custodial Credit Risk
- Concentrations of Credit Risk

In addition, other disclosures are specified including use of certain methods to present deposits and investments, highly sensitive investments, credit quality at year-end and other disclosures. In accordance with GASB Statement No. 31, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Certain Investments and for External Investment Pools, highly liquid market investments with maturities of one year or less at time of purchase are stated at amortized cost. All other investments are stated at fair value. Market value is used as fair value for those securities for which market quotations are readily available.

Allowance for Doubtful Accounts

Accounts receivable have not been reduced by an allowance for estimated uncollectable accounts as it is expected all such receivables are fully collectable.

Inventories and Prepaid Items

Inventories are valued at the average cost method.

Payments for membership for state water contractors reflect dues applicable to future accounting periods and are recorded as prepaid items.

Utility Plant

Utility plant is stated at original cost. Depreciation of utility plant used by the Watermaster is charged as an expense against its operations. Depreciation has been provided using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of five to seventy-five years. It is the policy of the Watermaster to capitalize property, plant and equipment with a cost of \$500 or more.

The capital cost component of the transportation charges and the Delta water charge the Watermaster pays for participation rights in the State Water Project are being capitalized as paid and amortized in accordance with instructions from the Controller of the State of California.

The Watermaster capitalizes interest relating to certain long-term construction projects and capitalizes a portion of general and administration costs relating to certain long-term projects.

Prior Year Data

Selected information regarding the prior year has been included in the accompanying financial statements. This information has been included for comparison purposed only and does not represent a complete presentation in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Accordingly, such information should be read in conjunction with the government's prior year financial statements, from which this selected financial data was derived. Also, certain amounts presented in the prior year data has been reclassified in order to be consistent with the current year's presentation.

Disclosures Relating to Interest Rate Risk

Interest rate risk is the risk that changes in market interest rates will adversely affect the fair value of an investment. Generally, the longer the maturity of an investment, the greater the sensitivity of its fair value to changes in market interest rates. One of the ways that the Watermaster manages its exposure to interest rate risk is by purchasing a combination of shorter term and longer term investments and by timing cash flows from maturities so that a portion of the portfolio is maturing or coming close to maturity evenly over time as necessary to provide the cash flow and liquidity needed for operations.

Information about the sensitivity of the fair values of the Watermaster's investments (including investments held by bond trustee) to market interest rate fluctuations is provided by the following table that shows the distribution of the Watermaster's investments by maturity:

Disclosures Relating to Credit Risk

Concentration of Credit Risk

The investment policy of the Agency contains no limitations on the amount that can be invested in any one issuer beyond that stipulated by the California Government Code. The Watermaster did not have any investments in any one issuer (other than U.S. Treasury securities, mutual funds, and external investment pools) that represent 5% or more of total investments (in total or for each reporting unit).

Custodial Credit Risk

Custodial credit risk for *deposits* is the risk that, in the event of the failure of a depository financial institution, a government will not be able to recover its deposits or will not be able to recover collateral securities that are in the possession of an outside party. The custodial credit risk for *investments* is the risk that, in the event of the failure of the counterparty (e.g., brokerdealer) to a transaction, a government will not be able to recover the value of its investment or collateral securities that are in the possession of another party. The California Government Code and the Agency's investment policy do not contain legal or policy requirements that would limit the exposure to custodial credit risk for deposits or investments, other than the following provision for deposits: The California Government Code requires that a financial institution secure deposits made by state or local governmental units by pledging securities in an undivided collateral pool held by a depository regulated under state law (unless so waived by the governmental unit). The market value of the pledged securities in the collateral pool must equal at least 110% of the total amount deposited by the public agencies. California law also allows financial institutions to secure deposits by pledging first trust deed mortgage notes having a value of 150% of the secured public deposits.

Investment in State Investment Pool

The Watermaster is a voluntary participant in the Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF) that is regulated by the California Government Code under the oversight of the Treasurer of the State of California. The fair value of the Watermaster's investment in this pool is reported in the accompanying financial statements at amounts based upon the Watermaster's pro-rata share of the fair value provided by LAIF for the entire LAIF portfolio (in relation to the amortized cost of that portfolio). The balance available for withdrawal is based on the accounting records maintained by LAIF, which are recorded on an amortized cost basis.

REPORT ON COMPLIANCE AND OTHER MATTERS AND ON INTERNAL CONTROL OVER FINANCIAL REPORTING BASED ON AN AUDIT OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS PERFORMED IN ACCORDANCE WITH GOVERNMENT AUDITING STANDARDS

We have audited the financial statements of the Mojave Basin Area Watermaster ("Watermaster"), a component unit of the Mojave Water Agency, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2009 and have issued our report thereon dated January 12, 2010. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.

Compliance and Other Matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the Watermaster's financial statements are free of material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit and, accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit, we considered the Watermaster's internal control over financial reporting in order to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the Watermaster's internal control over financial reporting. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Watermaster's internal control over financial reporting.

A control deficiency exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent or detect misstatements on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a control deficiency, or combination of control deficiencies, that adversely affect the Watermaster's ability to initiate, authorize, record, process, or report financial data reliably in accordance with generally

accounting principles such that there is more than a remote likelihood that a misstatement of the Watermaster's financial statements that is more than inconsequential will not be prevented or detected by the Watermaster's internal control.

A material weakness is a significant deficiency, or combination of significant deficiencies, that results in more than a remote likelihood that a material misstatement of the financial statements will not be prevented or detected by the Watermaster's internal control.

Our consideration of the internal control over financial reporting was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and would not necessarily disclose all deficiencies in internal control that might be significant deficiencies or material weaknesses. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting that we consider to be material weaknesses, as defined above.
