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CHAPTER 1

INTRODUCTION

This is the Fifth Annual Report of the Mojave Basin Area Watermaster to the Riverside County Superior Court pursuant to the Stipulated Judgment in City of Barstow, et al, vs. City of Adelanto, et al, and related cross-complaints, which were consolidated into Case No. 208568. The Stipulated Judgment addresses water supply shortages in the Mojave Basin Area through the creation of a Physical Solution based upon the allocation of responsibility for correction of annual overdraft and for maintaining historical average annual flows between Subareas.

The Stipulated Judgment requires the Watermaster to file an annual report with the Court by April 1 of each year. The required contents of the annual report are set forth in Section V (B), Paragraph 24 (k) of the Judgment.

Scope of Report

This Report is presented in two volumes. This volume (Volume I) summarizes most of the information required by the Stipulated Judgment and includes a summary of the Watermaster activities and water supply conditions for the 1997-98 Water Year. Volume II consists of a detailed accounting of surface water and groundwater production for the 1997-98 Water Year. Also included in Volume II is a listing of Base Annual Production ("BAP") transfers and changes in ownership. History of Litigation

Complaint. The original complaint was filed by the City of Barstow and Southern California Water Company in San Bernardino County Superior Court on May 30, 1990, and was transferred to Riverside County Superior Court on November 27, 1990. The complaint alleged that the cumulative water production upstream of the City of Barstow has overdrafted the Mojave River system and requested an average annual flow of 30,000 acre-feet of surface water to the City of Barstow area. The complaint also included a request for a writ of mandate to require the Mojave Water Agency ("MWA") to act pursuant to its statutory authority to obtain and provide supplemental water for use within the Mojave Basin Area.

MWA Cross-Complaint. On July 26, 1991, the MWA filed its first amended cross-complaint in the case, naming substantially all Producers of water within the Mojave Basin Area, including Parties downstream of the City of Barstow. The MWA cross-complaint requested a declaration that the available native water supply to the Mojave Basin Area is inadequate to meet the demands of the combined Parties and requested a determination of all of the water production of whatever nature within the Mojave Basin Area.

Arc Las Flores Cross-Complaint. On July 3, 1991, Arc Las Flores (Rancho Las Flores Ltd. Partnership) filed a cross-complaint asking that the appropriative, overlying and riparian rights of Arc Las Flores be determined to be prior and paramount to any rights of the Plaintiffs and other appropriators.

Negotiations, Trial and Judgment. Because of the magnitude and complexity of the case, numerous parties agreed to conduct good faith negotiations, beginning in early 1992, with the objective of devising an equitable solution to the Basin Area's water supply problems and avoiding extensive and expensive litigation. In the ensuing months a committee of attorneys, engineers, and other individuals that were generally representative of all types of producers and all Subareas of the Basin Area conducted intense negotiations that resulted in a proposed Stipulated Judgment. The proposal created a class of Minimal Producers (that is, Producers using ten acre-feet of water per year or less) who were dismissed from the case. The proposal also directed the MWA to create an administrative procedure, acceptable to the Court, by which Minimal Producers could participate fairly in the Physical Solution.

Over 75 percent of the parties agreed to the Stipulated Judgment which was entered by the Court on September 22, 1993, binding all stipulating parties. After entry of the Stipulated Judgment, additional parties agreed to its terms. These parties represented over 80 percent of the verified water production in the Basin. A trial of the claims of the non-stipulating parties began on February 6, 1995 and was completed on March 21, 1995. Final Judgment was entered on January 10, 1996 adopting the physical solution set forth in the Stipulated Judgment.

Fourth District Court of Appeals and California Supreme Court Review. Approximately nine non-stipulating parties referred to as the "Cardozo Group" chose to appeal the Judgment entered by the Superior Court. The Appellate Court issued a Tentative Opinion in April 1998 and received oral argument from both the stipulating and non-stipulating parties in May 1998. The Appellate Court issued its final opinion on June 1, 1998. The final opinion affirmed in part and reversed in part the Superior Court Judgment by excluding specific non-stipulating parties (the Cardozo Group) from the Superior Court Judgment and at the same time

affirming it as to the stipulating parties. The decision also remanded the issue of the amount of transferable production rights for Jess Ranch Water Company back to the Superior Court for a new determination.

The MWA board voted in June 1998 to seek California Supreme Court Review of the Appellate Court's decision. A petition for review was filed with the Supreme Court in July 1998 and the Supreme Court granted review of the case on August 26, 1998. The Supreme Court has yet to render its decision.

Summary of the Judgment

For purposes of defining and implementing a physical solution, the Basin is considered to consist of five distinct but hydrologically interrelated "Subareas." Each Subarea was found to be in overdraft to some extent due to the use of water by all of the producers in that Subarea. In addition, historically some Subareas were found to have received at least a part of their natural water supply from water flowing to them from upstream Subareas either on the surface or as subsurface flow. To maintain that historical relationship, the average annual obligation of any Subarea to another is set equal to the estimated average annual natural flow (excluding storm flow) between the Subareas over the 60 year period 1930-31 through 1989-90. If the Subarea obligation is not met, Producers of water that does not bear a replacement obligation in the upstream Subarea must provide makeup water.

To maintain proper water balances within each Subarea, the Judgment establishes a decreasing Free Production Allowance ("FPA") in each Subarea during the first five years and provides for the Court to review and adjust, as appropriate, the FPA for each Subarea annually thereafter. The FPA is allocated among the Producers in the Subarea based on each Producer's percentage share of the FPA. All water produced in excess of any Producer's share of the FPA must be replaced by the Producer, normally by payment to the Watermaster of funds sufficient to purchase Replacement Water.

Each Producer's percentage share of FPA in a Subarea was determined by first verifying the maximum annual production (called BAP) for each Producer during the five year, 1986-90,

Base Period and then calculating each Producer's percentage share of the total of all of such BAP in the Subarea. All such percentage allocations are of equal priority.

Producers in each Subarea are allowed to produce as much water as they need annually to meet their requirements, subject only to compliance with the Physical Solution set forth in the Judgment. An underlying assumption of the Judgment is that sufficient water will be made available to meet the needs of the Basin in the future from a combination of natural supply, imported water, water conservation, water reuse and transfers of FPA among parties.

Special provisions for environmental protection are included in the Judgment, including the creation of a Biological Resources Trust Fund.

MWA was appointed as the initial Watermaster by the Court to administer the Judgment and the Physical Solution set forth therein.

The Physical Solution

Replacement Water: Keeping Subareas in Balance. The amount of water that may be produced in a Subarea in any year by a Producer free of any replacement obligation is that Producer's share of the Subarea's FPA. During the first five years that the Judgment is in effect each Producer's share of the FPA in each of the five Subareas, expressed as a percentage of that Producer's BAP is as follows:

Water Year 1993-94 - 100 %

Water Year 1994-95 - 95 %

Water Year 1995-96 - 90 %

Water Year 1996-97 - 85 %

Water Year 1997-98 - 80 %

Before the end of the fifth year, and each year thereafter, the Watermaster must analyze conditions in each Subarea and recommend to the Court any increase or further reduction in FPA. The Judgment specifies factors that must be taken into consideration by the Watermaster

in the development of an FPA adjustment recommendation. Beginning with the sixth year, and each year thereafter, the FPA established by the Court for each Subarea will be allocated to Producers in the ratio of their respective share of the BAP in the Subarea.

Any Producer who produces in any year an amount of water in excess of that Producer's share of the FPA for a Subarea must pay the Watermaster a Replacement Water Assessment. The Watermaster then assumes responsibility for replacing such excess production. The Replacement Water Assessment for a Producer will be equal to the number of acre-feet of excess production by that Producer multiplied by the Replacement Water Assessment Rate per acre-foot as adopted annually by the Watermaster. It is the Watermaster's responsibility to acquire Replacement Water.

Makeup Water: Meeting Subarea Obligations. Both average and minimum annual flows must be maintained between adjoining Subareas. Each year an accounting will be made of the amount of such flows. Whenever the amount is less than the minimum amount required by the Judgment the Producers in the upstream Subarea must pay the Watermaster for Makeup Water to be delivered to the downstream Subarea.

If the actual flow in a year is more or less than the average Subarea Obligation then the upstream Subarea may receive a "credit" or "debit" that can offset any future deficiencies or surpluses.

The cost of Makeup Water will be recovered from Producers within the Subarea incurring the Makeup Obligation through a Makeup Water Assessment. Such assessment will be pro-rated among all production that does not bear a Replacement Obligation. It is the Watermaster's responsibility to acquire Makeup Water.

Administrative Assessment: Paying the Cost to Administer the Judgment. Costs of monitoring flows, verifying annual production, collecting assessments, preparing an annual report to the Court and other such costs will be recovered through a uniform Administrative Assessment against all production within the Basin Area. The Administrative Assessment will be payable quarterly when quarterly production reports are filed.

Transfers: Buying, Selling or Leasing BAP or FPA. The Judgment provides a framework for BAP or FPA to be bought, sold or leased within Subareas and between Subareas. For instance, a party who was allocated one percent of the FPA in a Subarea could lease that allocation to a second party in a private transaction. The second party could then produce additional water free of a Replacement Obligation.

The Judgment sets forth some rules governing transfers. The rules are designed to assure that the total consumptive use within a Subarea does not increase as a result of any transfer.

Biological Resource Mitigation: Protecting Species and Habitat. The Judgment contains unique provisions for assuring that the water needs of endangered and other species and of riparian habitat in the Mojave Basin Area are protected. Groundwater level standards are set in several key areas along the River. The Judgment must be administered in certain respects with the intent to meet the standards.

In the event standards are not met, a trust fund is established by the Judgment to provide money to buy water, construct wells or other projects proposed by the California Department of Fish and Game ("CDFG"). The trust fund, which is capped initially at \$1,000,000.00 will be financed by an escalating per acre-foot assessment on production beginning at \$0.50.

Producer Responsibilities: Reporting and Assessments. Each Producer is responsible for reporting accurately the amount of water produced and for paying all applicable assessments promptly. Any transfer of BAP or FPA or change in purpose of use must also be reported.

Subarea Advisory Committees. The Producers in each Subarea have elected a committee to advise the Watermaster on the administration of the Judgment. The California Department of Fish and Game is an ex-officio member of the Subarea Advisory Committees for the Alto and Baja Subareas.

Watermaster: Administering the Judgment for the Court. MWA was appointed the Watermaster initially. MWA or any subsequent appointee can be removed by the Court for failure to administer the Judgment properly and fairly.

The Watermaster is responsible for monitoring flows, verifying water production, reporting to the Court, collecting assessments and conducting studies.

The Watermaster must comply with the Brown Act regarding notices and meetings and with the Public Records Act regarding access to data and records.

CHAPTER 2

SUMMARY OF WATERMASTER ACTIVITIES

During the 1997-98 Water Year, the Mojave Basin Area Watermaster consisted of Robert Almond, Donald D. Brendel, Carl N. Dalton, Thomas H. Irwin, Beverly J. Lowry, George R. Parker and John H. Russell. Mr. Irwin and Mr. Parker served as Chairman and Vice Chairman respectively. Larry W. Rowe served as Executive Officer, Linda Lazar as Secretary and Paul E. Harmon as Treasurer.

The first Watermaster meeting of the 1997-98 Water Year was held on October 22, 1997, and ten additional meetings were held throughout the year. Copies of the minutes of the meetings as well as other official records are maintained and available at the office of the Watermaster which is located at 22450 Headquarters Drive, Apple Valley, CA 92307. In addition to the regular Watermaster meetings, beginning in October 1996 Watermaster workshop meetings were conducted on a monthly basis. The Watermaster will continue to hold monthly workshop meetings.

As required by the Judgment, the Watermaster prepared the Fourth Annual Report of the Mojave Basin Area Watermaster for Water Year 1996-97, which was published under the date April 1, 1998.

The Watermaster was presented with a Scope of Work prepared by the California Department of Fish and Game ("CDFG") for development of a Habitat Water Supply Management Plan. Exhibit H of the Judgment authorizes CDFG to use up to \$100,000 from the Biological Resources Trust Fund to develop a plan that will provide for the maintenance of species and riparian habitat. Exhibit H identifies specific species, habitat and riparian areas of concern. The Watermaster accepted the Scope of Work and authorized cost reimbursement for the development of the plan not to exceed \$100,000.

Actions taken by the Watermaster during the year included approval of the Administrative Budget for Water Year 1998-99 and approval of Replacement Water, Makeup Water, Administrative and Biological Assessments Rates for Water Year 1998-99.

The Administrative Budget and Assessment Rates for 1998-99 were adopted and are summarized on Table 2-1.

Water Production and Verification

In order to document water usage and to determine each Producer's Replacement Water and Makeup Water Obligations, the Judgment provides for the collection, analysis, and verification of annual water production by Producers within each of the five Subareas beginning with Water Year 1993-94. All Producers are required to file quarterly statements of production. Verification of production during the 1997-98 Water Year was conducted by the Watermaster staff and included verification of all parties to the Judgment.

The verified production by all parties for the Water Year 1997-98 is assembled and presented in Volume II of this report. Verification methodology for the 1997-98 water production verification process was essentially the same as that used in previous years.

Section 11 of the Rules and Regulations sets forth the criteria for monitoring production. The Watermaster informed certain Producers by letter dated June 30, 1998, of their responsibility to measure production in accordance with the terms of the Judgment and the Rules and Regulations. Watermaster will continue its efforts to obtain voluntary compliance with the Rules and Regulations from each Producer.

Streamflow, Precipitation and Other Data

Various data, including streamflow and precipitation data, are needed to estimate the natural water supplies accruing to each Subarea and to calculate compliance with certain Subarea obligations. Streamflow data required by the Watermaster were for the most part furnished by the U.S. Geological Survey ("USGS"). The MWA, under a Cooperative Agreement with the USGS, currently funds 50 percent of the stream gage operation and maintenance at the Deep Creek, Lower Narrows, Barstow, and Afton stations. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers ("ACOE") funds the West Fork Mojave River and Mojave River near Hesperia gages. Beginning with the 1993-94 Water Year, the frequency of direct measurements at the Lower Narrows was increased from once to twice monthly in order to improve the record. The measurements were subsequently increased from twice monthly to weekly during the 1995-96 Water Year, a practice which continued through the 1997-98 Water Year. With the exception of the Lower Narrows, the data provided by USGS for the Mojave River is generally considered to

be "fair" to "good". The data at Lower Narrows has generally been considered to be "poor". However, the frequency of direct measurements, particularly during the low flow periods, suggests that the quality of the low flow record is "good" or even better.

The USGS recently conducted a review of its measurement procedures and statistical data analysis procedures for the Lower Narrows gage and reported in a letter to Mr. Larry Rowe dated December 17, 1998 that the "published stream flow records represent the best determinations of flow possible given the primary data collected in support of the stream flow gaging stations". The USGS concluded by saying that it is confident that its flow measurement and computation techniques will be found adequate and stream flow records validated.

Records of the discharge of reclaimed wastewater to the Mojave River downstream from the Lower Narrows gage were furnished by the Victor Valley Wastewater Reclamation Authority ("VVWRA"). These discharge records are used to determine the contribution of the VVWRA discharge to the Alto Subarea's annual flow obligation to Centro.

Precipitation data utilized by the Watermaster are compiled from records obtained from the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration ("NOAA") for Lake Arrowhead, Victorville, and Barstow precipitation stations.

Related MWA Activities

The Mojave Water Agency published its Third Annual Engineer's Report summarizing programs related to water supply, including supplemental water imports, construction of facilities, and hydrologic conditions within the Agency's boundaries during Water Year 1996-97

In addition to the foregoing, the Mojave Water Agency in cooperation with USGS continued its geohydrologic investigations of water flow across the Helendale Fault and across the Agency's eastern boundary where the Mojave River flows beyond the adjudicated area. This work has included the installation of multi-nested monitoring wells in the Transition Zone in the Alto Subarea and in the Baja Subarea. The USGS also continued development of a groundwater flow model for the Mojave River Basin.

The Agency continued its effort to catalogue thousands of wells as part of the development of a Minimal Producer Program and continued gathering and analyzing data regarding water use by minimal producers.

The Mojave Water Agency held a groundbreaking ceremony on March 24, 1997 for the Mojave River Pipeline. The initial phase of the project was the construction of Reach 1A extending 17 miles from the California aqueduct to Oro Grande. Reach 1A was completed in December 1997. Reach 1B and 2 extending from Oro Grande to recharge facilities at Hodge and Lenwood is scheduled to be completed by April 1999.

The Agency will develop percolation ponds to provide groundwater recharge in the Lucerne Valley area of up to 5,000 acre-feet annually of State Water Project water delivered via the Agency's Morongo Basin Pipeline. Environmental review of the Lucerne Valley Recharge Project was completed in August of 1997. A 10 acre site was subsequently purchased and recharge ponds have been designed.

On March 26, 1996, the Mojave Water Agency Board of Directors approved the purchase of 25,000 acre-feet of State Water Project Entitlement from Berrenda Mesa Water District in Kern County increasing Mojave Water Agency's entitlement by 50% to a total of 75,800 acrefeet. The acquisition of this additional entitlement is expected to meet the water demands for the Agency service area through the year 2015. A draft environmental impact report was circulated during 1996 with the Agency certifying the EIR on October 29, 1996. A validation hearing was held on October 7, 1996 to obtain approval of the Court. On January 31, 1997 the MWA signed an amended State Water Contract with the Department of Water Resources to reflect that MWA's Table A Entitlement was increased to 75,800 acre-feet as a result of the transfer from Berrenda Mesa Water District.

Pursuant to an exchange agreement between MWA and Solano County Water Agency ("SCWA") entered into on October 28, 1997, MWA received 2,000 acre-feet of SCWA State Water Project water during the months of November and December 1997. The exchange agreement provides that MWA receives two acre-feet of SCWA entitlement for each acre-foot of MWA entitlement transferred to SCWA.

Transfers

There were 170 transfers of FPA and Carryover FPA during the year. These transfers are reported in Appendix E of Volume I. There were 45 transfers of BAP. Transfers of BAP are reported in Appendix E of Volume I and Table 9 of Volume II. Any additional transfers of unused 1997-98 FPA that may take place prior to June 1, 1999, will be reported in Appendix E of the Watermaster's Annual Report for 1998-99.

Rules and Regulations

The Rules and Regulations that were adopted by Watermaster June 30, 1994 and revised December 11, 1996 remain in effect.

Biological Resources Trust Fund

The Biological Resources Assessment Rate for 1997-98 was \$0.52 per acre-foot. There were no expenditures from the Biological Resources Trust Fund proposed by the Department of Fish and Game during the year.

The Biological Resources Assessment Rate for 1998-99 was increased to \$0.53 per acrefoot.

Storage Agreements

A Storage Agreement between MWA and the Watermaster covering each Subarea was approved during the 1994-95 Water Year and remains in effect.

CHAPTER 3

WATER SUPPLY CONDITIONS


After experiencing below average precipitation during 1996-97, the precipitation in the Mojave River Watershed during 1997-98, as measured at Lake Arrowhead was above average at about 165 percent of the 60 Year Base Period average. The combined flow of the West Fork Mojave River and Deep Creek during the 1997-98 Water Year was about 260 percent of the 60 Year Base Period average.


Precipitation during 1997-98

Rainfall in the mountain areas is the principal source of natural water supply to the Mojave Basin Area. During the 1997-98 Water Year the precipitation at Lake Arrowhead amounted to 68.5 inches which is about 165 percent of the Base Period average of 41.5 inches. The maximum monthly rainfall of 23.64 inches occurred in February with 11.63 inches and 9.93 inches occurring during May and March, respectively. Figure 3-1 shows the seasonal precipitation from 1930-31 through 1997-98 and the accumulated departure from the 1930-31 through 1989-90 Base Period average. Seasonal rainfall within the Basin Area as measured at Victorville and Barstow totaled 12.78 inches and 10.29 inches, respectively. The amount recorded at Victorville represents approximately 227 percent of the annual average of 5.64 inches and the amount recorded at Barstow represents approximately 228 percent of the annual average of 4.51 inches. Figure 3-2 shows the seasonal precipitation at Victorville and Barstow.

Runoff during 1997-98

Locations of stream flow gages for the Mojave River system are shown on Appendix A of Volume I. Table 3-1 shows monthly discharge amounts for 1997-98 at these locations.







At the Forks

The total flow of the Mojave River at the Forks during 1997-98 as measured by the combined discharges of the West Fork Mojave River and Deep Creek was 170,132 acre-feet or about 260 percent of the Base Period average of 65,540 acre-feet. The combined discharges of the West Fork Mojave River and Deep Creek for the period 1930-31 through 1997-98 and the accumulated departure from the Base Period average are shown on Figure 3-3.

At Lower Narrows


The total surface flow of the Mojave River at the Lower Narrows was 83,517 acre-feet which is about 160 percent of the 60 Year Base Period average of 51,960 acre-feet. During Water Year 1997-98 the total flow accruing to the Lower Narrows Gage was estimated to consist of 73,355 acre-feet of storm flow and 10,162 acre-feet of base flow. Figure 3-4 shows the storm and base flow components of the total flow in the Mojave River at the Lower Narrows for the period 1930-31 through 1997-98.


At Barstow




At Afton


The total surface flow of the Mojave River at Afton was 1,287 acre-feet which is about 16% percent of the Base Period average of 8,247 acre-feet. During 1997-98 the total flow accruing to the Afton Gage was estimated to consist of 935 acre-feet of storm flow and 352 acre-feet of base flow. Figure 3-5 shows the storm and base flow components of the total flow in the Mojave River at Afton for the period 1930-31 through 1997-98.

Victor Valley Wastewater Reclamation Authority Wastewater Effluent Discharges

The VVWRA delivers treated wastewater effluent to the Mojave River downstream from the Lower Narrows. This water is credited toward the Alto Subarea's Obligation to the Centro Subarea and amounted to 9,353 acre-feet for the 1997-98 Water Year. The seasonal wastewater effluent discharge to the Mojave River for the period 1985-86 through 1997-98 is shown on Figure 3-4.

Imported Water Deliveries by MWA

During 1997-98 MWA delivered 4,636 acre-feet of imported State Water Project water to the Alto and Centro Subareas. The monthly distribution was as follows:

Watermaster reported imported water deliveries to the Centro Subarea for January 1997 to be 8 acre-feet in the 1996-97 Annual Report. The actual amount delivered was 79 acre-feet.

CHAPTER 4

STATUS OF REPLACEMENT WATER AND MAKEUP WATER OBLIGATIONS

Appendix B summarizes each Producer's Replacement Water and Makeup Water Obligations as well as any related assessments due and payable by July 1, 1999.

Replacement Water

Each Producer's Replacement Water Obligation in each Subarea was calculated by subtracting that Producer's 1997-98 share of FPA (plus any transferred or carryover FPA) from that Producer's verified production in 1997-98. Each Producer's Replacement Water Assessment was calculated by multiplying that Producer's Replacement Water Obligation by the 1997-98 Replacement Water Assessment Rate of \$181.00 per acre-foot. In lieu of paying Replacement Water Assessments, a Producer may satisfy a Replacement Obligation in a Subarea by acquiring another Producer's Unused FPA from 1997-98 in the same Subarea (subject to any consumptive use adjustments) and reporting such acquisition to the Watermaster on appropriate forms provided by the Watermaster not later than 30 days prior to the regularly scheduled Watermaster Meeting in May 1999. Unused FPA during 1997-98 for each Producer within each Subarea is set forth in Appendix B of Volume I.

Table 4-1 summarizes the Replacement Water Obligations and Assessments and Unused FPA for 1997-98 in each Subarea.

Transition Zone

The Judgment requires the establishment and maintenance of certain minimum groundwater levels in the Transition Zone as soon as practicable. Such levels have not yet been established. The Judgment requires that until minimum groundwater levels in the Transition Zone are set, production in the Transition Zone that exceeds the total Transition Zone FPA for the year must be replaced in the Transition Zone during the next year. The total verified production in the Transition Zone during 1997-98 was 14,017 acre-feet and the total FPA for Transition Zone Producers was 29,210 acre-feet. Therefore, there is no mandatory Transition Zone replacement obligation for 1997-98.

Makeup Water

The Alto and Centro Subarea Advisory Committees each hired a hydrologic consultant and in cooperation with the Watermaster Engineer participated in the base flow determination for the 1997-98 Water Year. The base flow value for 1997-98 of 10,162 acre-feet reported on Table 4-2 was adopted by the Watermaster at a public hearing on January 27, 1999, and represents the average of the determinations by the Watermaster Engineer, the Alto Subarea Advisory Committee expert and the Centro Subarea Advisory Committee expert.

Table 4-2 summarizes the flows credited to each Subarea Obligation during Water Year 1997-98, the status of each Subarea at the end of the year and each minimum obligation for Water Year 1998-99.

During the first ten years of implementation of the Judgment, the subsurface flow obligations between Subareas will be assumed to be met, pending the installation of monitoring wells and completion of studies that are specified in the Judgment. Only water flowing or delivered on the surface will be monitored during the first ten years.

The Watermaster implemented a policy to facilitate the acquisition of FPA in the Centro Subarea, by producers in the Alto Subarea who owe a Makeup Water Obligation to Centro. The FPA acquired in Centro to satisfy the Alto Makeup Water Obligation must be at least twice the outstanding obligation, rounded up to the next whole acre-foot amount.

The Alto to Centro obligation of 2,897 acre-feet incurred in the 1996-97 Water Year was satisfied in part (2,667 acre-feet) by the acquisition of Centro FPA. Makeup Water purchases including the acquisition of Centro FPA and Makeup Water purchases from the Watermaster of 203 acre-feet totaled 2,870 acre-feet. The actual obligation for the 1996-97 Water Year was 2,897 acre-feet. The difference of 27 acre-feet was due to a reduction in the obligation of two producers.

CHAPTER 5

FREE PRODUCTION ALLOWANCE FOR WATER YEAR 1999-2000

During the first five years that the Judgment is in effect each Producer's share of the Free Production Allowance (FPA) in each of the five Subareas is set by the Court. For Water Year 1997-98, the fifth year since entry of the Stipulated Judgment each Producer's FPA is set at 80% of that Producer's Base Annual Production (BAP) amount specified in the Judgment.

The Watermaster set the Free Production Allowance for 1998-99 in each of the five Subareas at 80% of each Producer's Base Annual Production amount. The Watermaster also proposed that this same level of FPA be maintained for the 1999-2000 Water Year.

The Watermaster's recommendation was based on the various elements affecting water supply, use and disposal and on the fact that water production has decreased since entry of the Judgment, and that since 1990, there were two very wet years which produced a significant amount of recharge. The Watermaster considered these factors and concluded that additional ramp down could be postponed at least a year or two without long-term harm to the basin.

During the 1997-98 Water Year the basin experienced 160% of the long-term average precipitation at Lake Arrowhead. Equally important however is that precipitation at Victorville was measured to be about 227% of the long-term average. This resulted in a considerable reduction in total pumping of about 30,000 acre-feet basin wide. With a return to a dry water year cycle or even average precipitation amounts, total pumping is very likely to increase to previous levels.

Due to the reduction in total pumping and the very wet climate of the past few years, the Watermaster is again recommending that FPA remain unchanged during 1999-2000 as proposed Water Year. This recommendation is made with caution and it should be noted that continued ramp down in the future is likely. The Watermaster will continue to collect relevant data and evaluate the hydrologic conditions in the basin and if warranted recommend additional ramp down.

The Mojave Water Agency updated its Regional Water Management Plan with respect to the changes in hydrologic inventory between 1991 and 1997 inclusive. Although this seven year period saw a significant increase in total available basin inflow, only a modest increase in storage resulted. Overdraft however is predicated on the long-term average annual natural water supply (Base Period 1931-1990). The current estimate of the available natural supply, accounting for phreatophyte consumption and long-term outflow at Afton is about 45,000 acrefeet. Total water production during 1997-98 was about 150,000 acre-feet or about 3 times the available supply. Hence as measured against the base period average supply the basins continue to be in a state of overdraft.

The current level of water production is considerably lower than the base period maximum amount. The fact that there has been ample precipitation the past few years and the fact that there has been an increasing number of transfers to offset overproduction, affords the Watermaster the ability to manage the basin resource in the short-term without causing any long-term harm. Quite simply, nature has provided the opportunity for the producers to adjust to ramp down, and for the Watermaster to continue to collect data to assess the impacts of the current 20% reduction in Free Production Allowance.

The Watermaster also has considered that the pending Supreme Court review of the Judgment may create a measure of uncertainty with regard to management of the basin's water resources. This fact, as well as the foregoing is sufficient reason for the Watermaster to proceed cautiously in connection with further ramp down.



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



Note 1: Organization and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Organization

The Mojave Basin Area Watermaster ("Watermaster") was organized September 22, 1993, pursuant to a Stipulated Judgment by the Superior Court of the State of California for the County of Riverside. In the Judgment, the Mojave Water Agency was appointed as the initial Watermaster, which is responsible for administering the Judgment for the Court. Since the Watermaster meets the reporting entity criteria established by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB), the Watermaster's financial statements have also been included in the Financial Statements of the Mojave Water Agency as a "component unit" for the fiscal years ended June 30, 1998 and 1997.

The Judgment divided the Mojave Basin into five distinct but hydrologically interrelated "Subareas," each of which was found to be in overdraft to some extent due to the use of water by Producers in that Subarea. To maintain proper water balances, the Judgment established a decreasing Free Production Allowance ("FPA") in each Subarea during the first five years and provides for the Court to review and adjust, as appropriate, the FPA for each Subarea annually thereafter. All water produced in excess of any Producer's share of the FPA must be replaced by the Producer. Each Producer's share of the FPA in a Subarea was determined by verifying the maximum annual production, or Base Annual Production ("BAP"), for each Producer during the five-year base period, 1986-1990, then calculating each Producer's share of the total BAP in that Subarea. All Producers in each Subarea are allowed to produce as much water as they need to meet their requirements in the future, subject only to compliance with the Judgment. Special provisions for environmental protection are included in the Judgment, including the creation of a Biological Resources Trust Fund.

The Watermaster is responsible for monitoring, verifying production, reporting to the Court, collecting assessments and conducting studies.

Uniform Accounting System and Basis of Accounting

The accounts of Mojave Basin Area Watermaster have been maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and in conformity with the California State Controller's uniform system of accounts. Basis of accounting refers to when revenues and expenses are recognized in the accounts and reported in the financial statements. Revenues and expenses are recognized on the accrual basis. Revenues are recognized in the accounting period in which they are earned and expenses are recognized in the period incurred.

Notes to Financial Statements

June 30, 1998 and 1997

Note 1: Organization and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents have been defined as demand deposits and highly liquid investments purchased with an original maturity of three months or less.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Accounts Receivable and Allowance for Bad Debts

The Watermaster considers accounts receivable to be fully collectible; accordingly, no allowance for doubtful accounts is required.

Note 2: Personnel

The Watermaster is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of the seven members of Mojave Water Agency's Board of Directors. Watermaster operations are supervised by an appointed Executive Officer. The Mojave Water Agency's employees perform administrative services for the Watermaster. As of June 30, 1998, the Board and Executive Officers were as follows:

Note 3: Cash

The Watermaster may invest monies in accordance with Section 53601 of the California Government Code.

California Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF):

The LAIF is a special fund of the California State Treasury through which local governments may pool investments. The Agency may invest up to \$20,000,000 in the fund. Investments in the LAIF are highly liquid, as deposits can be converted to cash within 24 hours without loss of interest. All investments with the LAIF are secured by the full faith and credit of the State of California.

Classification of Deposits by Credit Risk:

GASB 3 requires that deposits be classified into three categories of credit risk. These categories are as follows:

Deposits:

Category 1 - Deposits which are insured by FDIC, FSLIC, a state depository insurance fund, or a multiple-financial institution collateral pool; or deposits which are collateralized with securities held by the Watermaster or the Watermaster's agent in the Watermaster's name.

Category 2 - Deposits which are collateralized with securities held by the pledging financial institution's trust department or agent in the Watermaster's name.

Category 3 - Deposits which are uncollateralized, or collateralized but the pledged securities are not held in the Watermaster's name.

All cash and certificates of deposit are entirely insured or collateralized. The California Government Code requires California banks and savings and loan associations to secure a local agency's deposits by pledging government securities as collateral. The market value of the pledged securities must equal at least 110% of an agency's deposits. California law also allows financial institutions to secure an agency's deposits by pledging first trust deed mortgage notes having a value of 150% of an agency's total deposits.

The agency may waive collateral requirements for deposits which are fully insured up to \$100,000 by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) or Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation (FSLIC).

The Watermaster, in response to a Judgement of the Court, assesses Producers for their share of excess production, administration and environmental protection. The assessments receivable are considered by Management, in response to the Court Order, to be fully collectible. All uncollected assessments are appropriately liened; accordingly, no allowance for doubtful accounts is required.

The Watermaster's receivables include assessments of \$85,113 of nine Nonstipulating Producers who appealed the Lower Court's decision. The Appellant Court upheld the Stipulated Judgement, but ruled that the contesting parties were not bound by the Judgement. The California Supreme Court granted the Watermaster's Petition for Review. While resolution of this case is anticipated in January, 2000, no opinion can be expressed as to how the Court will rule.

In addition, the Watermaster's receivables include \$476,548 for assessments of a Nonstipulating Major Producer who originally participated in but dropped out of the Appeals Process. The Producer's property has been liened accordingly.

The Watermaster's policy is not to purchase make-up or replacement water until assessments have been collected. In the event assessments are not collected, then receivables and respective reserves will be reduced and should have no effect on unreserved balances, which are supported by the Mojave Water Agency.
